Yes, this year's Admiral Windwagon Smith is a humble man, always comfortable working behind the scenes at Riverfest. But this year he's the very public face of Wichita's biggest party and one of the top 40 worldwide events in terms of ticket

sales (from Pollstar).

Both the Admiral and the CEO of Wichita Festivals, Inc., Mary Beth Jarvis, spoke at Rotary this week. The great news about Riverfest is that the volunteers and staff are always working to make this event even more fun and safe.

For example, a decision in 2013 to fence and gate the footprint of the festival ensured that only button holders could enter event areas. Another change a few years back was moving the event to June after school is out and graduation ceremonies are over.

Today's Riverfest includes amenities such as water refill stations, phone charging stations, heat-beating amenities such as misting tents, giant fans, and shaded food court seating. There's a Riverfest app that features a live map, real-time schedule updates, Spotify playlists, a scavenger hunt, and push notifications.

Staff scout acts all over the U.S. looking for musical and entertainment acts that appeal to a variety of audiences. There's always a balancing act of adding new events to appeal to new festival goers while keeping popular long-time acts. According to Jarvis, 23 of the 126 events scheduled this year are new.

So if you're new to town and haven't experienced Riverfest, or if you haven't been in a few years, come on out this year. And if you see a guy wearing a bright red jacket and Admiral's hat, come on over and say hi!
