News From the District Governor

This week's speaker was our District Governor, Kurt Harper. Kurt and his wife, (whom he refers to as his executive assistant) Kelly, are both Wichita natives. Kurt attended The University of Kansas where he earned a bachelors in Russian Language and Literature before, later, acquiring his law degree. Kurt has been a member



of Rotary since 1995 and has served in numerous leadership positions including as a club president and a district representative to the Russia-U.S. Intercountry Committee. Kurt's close association with Russia has, naturally, attracted him to the international aspects of the Rotary mission.

With his speech, Kurt covered the current state of the Rotary Mission, as well as new changes on the Rotary landscape; including an expanding of the district from one that contained 30 clubs to a 60 club district. Kurt's disctrict, and the one we occupy, in addition to growing, has changed it's makeup; now including more clubs in populated industrial areas as opposed to the largely rural areas that it previously covered. He now has clubs ranging from 400 members (in his largest) to 8-member clubs. With such a varying size of clubs, there are no shortage of opportunities for anyone to get involved, at some level, with Rotary.

In regards to Rotary's effort to eradicate Polio, Kurt shared that it's presence has been diminished throughout the world; with Nigeria recently celebrating their 3rd anniversary of being Polio-Free! Afghanistan and Pakistan are the only countries on earth left with traces of the disease and are being targeted despite their complicated barries, both physically and culturally. The Rotary has been integral to the mission for not only Polio, but has also provided valuable infrastructure for the battle against other diseases such as Ebola in Africa.

In addition to briefing us on all the new initiatives and partnerships throughout rotary, Kurt employed us to continue thinking of ways the District can improve our Rotary experience. He remains focused on increasing our membership, our volunteer hours, and our International giving. Above all, he encourages everyone to continue to serve in whatever capacity we are able to serve.

Business Brief - Shane Pullman

Shane Pullman delivered the 2nd of our returning Business Briefs for the year. Shane currently serves on the board handling our Social Media and is a Commercial Advisor for NAI Martens.
