Sarah Wine introduced her co-worker, and this week's speaker, Rick Bumgardner, from Roxy's Downtown. Rick was the son of an Air Force man. His dad was stationed in Puerto Rico for a time and then throughout the country before he retired to Golden Plains. Here, Rick attended High School and then WSU where he graduated Summa Cum Laude; an honor that disappointed him until he



realized that it was actually better than Magna Cum Laude(which was news to me also). After WSU, Rick went to the University of Connecticut for graduate school. Upon completion, he returned to Kansas City where he spent 29 years as a single father raising his son. Last year he took over the reigns of Roxy's Downtown as the Creative Director.

In accepting his role with Roxy's and moving to Wichita, Rick was faced with 3 big questions for this new endeavor. As a theater, they had to ask themselves '**1. Who are you? 2. What do you want? And 3. What's your purpose?'** The exercise led to answers that have helped them focus their efforts and put out a product that will grow from 8 shows in 2019 to 10 shows in 2020. Roxy's mission, as described on their website, is:

"To entertain, inform, educate, and support Wichita and surrounding communities through innovative performances, conscientious educational programming and dedicated event facilities and services. And, in the process, continuously strive to inspire the community by introducing new sights, sounds and tastes to celebrate and embrace the diverse beauty of being alive and being awake"

The recipe has worked. Rick's mission of "pushing the envelope to challenge the audience" has proven effective. He shared the story of the impact that the show "**Dog Sees God**" has had on audience members in attacking the tough issues that face families today. The show gives an interesting take on the *Peanuts* gang's teenage years.

In addition to a great slate of shows, Roxy's has found themselves praised as a great place to get a meal. Rick made the comment that he "never thought they'd be running a restaurant," but many have commented on the surprisingly good food that they receive



while at a show(even though he made it clear that they are NOT a dinner theater).

If you get a chance, check out a show at Roxy's Downtown and support their mission. They are currently showing "**Forbidden Broadway**" and will be starting a Radio Show on August 22nd.
