

HOW RAINBOWS UNITED HELPS CHILDREN AND FAMILIES

This photo, taken from the Rainbows United website, shows a staff person interacting with a parent and child. Rainbows offers 11 different services, with the biggest being its birth to 3 program. Parents can request a free home evaluation if they see that their child is not achieving developmental milestones. 98% of the services Rainbows provides are outside of their facilities.

ainbows United was founded in 1972 as a developmental training center for children with severe, multiple disabilities who were ineligible for special education services provided through the public schools. Since then the organization has evolved to focus on delivery of early intervention services to children below school age.

The organization has two locations in Wichita: Kids' Point at K96 and Oliver, and Kids' Cove at 21st and Lakeway, near Sedgwick County Park. Children at Kids' Point receive early childhood education and childcare services. Kids' Cove provides services for school-aged children during the summer, providing case management and other services health insurance typically does not cover.

Another service Rainbows United offers is specialized foster care homes. They recruit foster families who are open to having a child with special needs as part of their home.

The agency also provides mental health services for young children, offering strategies for behavior and emotional regulation. Staff may work with students in an entire classroom, helping them learn to cope with anger and sadness, or learning how to help a friend.

Providing services to all families in need, regardless of their ability to pay, is an important part of Rainbows' mission. That is why fundraising is essential in helping bridge the gap between program costs and income. Coming up next month is the annual Blarney Breakfast, which will take place on Friday, March 15 at Old Chicago East from 6-9:30 a.m. Fashion Passion is another major fundraiser that raised more than \$1 million last year. The event will take place at the Textron Aviation Activity Center on May 10. A highlight this year will be the raffle of a 2024 Lexus RX350. Raffle tickets are just \$100; to purchase, visit Rainbows website.

We thank today's speakers, Michelle Eastman and Lisa Capps, for their presentation today and for making a difference to families and children here in our community.
