## MEET WICHITA MAYOR, LILY WU



Lily Wu is the 103rd mayor of Wichita and the first Asian-American to serve in that position. In the general election held last November, Wu defeated the incumbent mayor by just over 10,000 votes. A former television reporter and anchor, Wu moved to Wichita as a child from Guatemala, where her working-class parents arrived from China. Wu speaks fluent Cantonese, Spanish, and English.

hen Lily Wu addressed East Wichita Rotary last June, she spoke about her love for Wichita and gratitude for the many mentors who have shaped her life.

She's even more grateful now, having won the local mayoral election handily by promising to restore trust in City Hall, keeping families safe, and opposing tax increases.

But to do her job well, she emphasized that she needs to hear from *all* Wichitans, including business owners and not-for-profit agency representatives. She encouraged citizens to attend weekly City Council meetings, which take place on the first, second, and third Tuesdays of the month at City Hall, 455 N. Main.

Another way citizens can participate in city government is to become involved with one of the many advisory boards or committees that provide expertise and guidance to the City Council and staff. The City's website at Wichita.gov lists the various boards and committees as well as an application form.

Mayor Wu devoted half of her presentation to Q & A. Here is a portion:

Q: What are your biggest challenges right now?

A: The issue of housing homeless persons in our community. I've attended task force meetings and this issue will require city, county, and not-for-profits working together to solve the problem. The County Commission just elected Ryan Baty as chairman and Sarah

Lopez as Chair Pro Tem. They, along with Councilman J.V. Johnston and me will meet soon. In addition, state legislators are working on the creation of a mental health hospital, a top priority for this region.

Q: We continue to export our best and brightest young people to other communities. What is being done to keep them here?

A: Brain drain is real. Why do our top young people leave? Because they have good job opportunities elsewhere. We need to increase job opportunities for them to offer more choices. I'm encouraged by the example of Novacoast, [a cybersecurity, identity and access company], which moved its headquarters from California to Wichita in 2022. We have something special here! Let's all be better advocates of our city and its people!
