## MEET KEVIN SAAL, WSU'S 19TH DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

aving a father who was an industrial/organizational psychology professor and a mother who was an academic advisor, both at K-State, made for interesting dinner table conversation, according to Kevin Saal. To him, these conversations framed a mindset focused on the importance of student development in a university environment.

That mindset provides the foundation for the way Saal views and treats student-athletes. He believes they are students first, emphasizing the importance of their academic career. Their wider role as persons in the community comes next, then their role as players, and finally, achieving the status of being professionals, meaning people who are gainfully

employed. This process of student development prioritizes the "Shocker Way" core values of character, integrity, knowledge and stewardship.

Saal shared several interesting statistics about WSU student-athletes. Currently there are just over 250 student-athletes representing 30 U.S. states and 24 countries. Of those, 117 are on full scholarship. More than half are the first generation in their families to attend college.

This diverse background of cultures and life experiences could make academic life challenging for student-athletes, but the fact is that they outperform the general student body. For the past 17 consecutive years/34 semesters, WSU's athletics department has maintained a 3.0 overall GPA. During the

spring of 2022, they achieved a 3.3 GPA. In his five-year plan, Saal would like to attain a 3.3 GPA at least five out of the next ten semesters, and reach 3.4 at least once.

In addition to Shocker athletes' academic performance, Saal also has his eyes on more championships. Since joining the AAC (American Athletic Conference) in 2017, the Shockers have won six AAC championships in women's cross country, men's and women's outdoor track and field, volleyball, softball, and men's basketball. He admits his goal is aggressive and bold: with 15 sports programs making up WSU's athletics program, Saal seeks to win 15 championships in the next five years. With his razor-sharp focus and wealth of experience in athletics, Kevin Saal is a man with a strong, achievable vision for Shocker Nation.
