Saving Wichita

Finally was our program speaker; John DeCesaro. In addition to his role as a VP of Marketing at Fidelity Bank, John has worn several hats throughout his career; including leadership positions with the Young Professionals of Wichita, The Wichita American Marketing Association, The American Red Cross Midway-Kansas Chapter, The Wichita Public Library Foundation, The Tallgrass Film Association and Rainbows United. While each of these roles



could've filled a half-hour speech on their own, John used his time with us to chat about one of his passionate roles as an editor for **The Chung Report**.

The Chung Report, for those who weren't aware (just me I think) is an online initiative dedicated to tackling the economic challenges facing the city of Wichita. The site derives its name from James Chung; a data analyst with his company, **Reach Advisors**. They, in conjunction with the **Wichita Community Foundation** conducted a multi-year study of the Wichita landscape in 2014-2015 and released a series of presentations they referred to as 'Focus Forward'. While the initiative *does* derive their name from Mr. Chung, the site has no procedural ties to James or the Wichita Community Foundation.

The results of the study were a bit bleak and James worried that the city may be approaching the point of no return. He identified 4 key challenges to the Wichita economy in his projected decline; The **Business Cycle**, **Human Capital**, **Entrepreneurship**, and **Perception**. These are the challenges around which the initiative is centered with the stated core purpose of:

"Stimulating collaboration, business growth, and entrepreneurial energy as we rise in utter defiance of our city's projected decline".



The reports that were presented offered up valuable information for the city and many worried that the information may be received, contemplated for a bit, and eventually forgotten about. Leaving Wichita destined to the unfortunate fate that has befallen so many manufacturing towns throughout the country. It was for that reason that The Chung Report was created. It was a way to keep the city's economic issues top-of-mind in our discourse, with the hope that productive collaboration would lead to tangible results.

The site will be 3 years old at the end of this month and has already uncovered some promising trends. In addressing the *Perception* challenge, more Wichitans said they want to stay than want to leave in 2018. This was a flip in results from the same question asked in 2016. It would stand to reason, then, that the overall optimism among Wichitans grew by 16% in that same timeframe.
