At our table we discussed an upcoming fundraiser to benefit Project Access, a local not-for-profit organization that helps low-income adults without health insurance access donated medical care for serious health conditions. Shelley Duncan, Executive Director of Central Plains Health Care Partnership, explained the "Over the Edge" building rappel event to the others at

her table. Participants will rappel 19 stories down the New York Life building in downtown Wichita. The event takes place on Saturday, August 30.

We discussed topics covered by previous EWR speakers. For example, just exactly what is concierge or retainer medicine? Dr. Josh Umbehrr, founder of Atlas MD, spoke on this topic at EWR on October 4, 2017. Primary care physicians provide enhanced services to a limited number of patients for a monthly fee. This often results in an unhurried office setting. Also, patients have greater access to their physician through phone calls and emails. One EWR member signed up for this service as a result of learning about it at EWR.

Other groups discussed possible speakers for upcoming EWR meetings in the new Rotary year that begins on July 1, 2019.

Enjoying a meal and catching up with friends is one of the many great benefits of EWR membership. Learning about the assets and services in our community is another. As we approach the beginning of a new year of service above self to our club and our community, think about people you know who will add to the life and vitality of our club.
