DANIEL GOMEZ: HOW TO DEVELOP A MILLIONAIRE MINDSET



Daniel Gomez, pictured here with his agent, Mindy East, is an awardwinning keynote speaker, business coach, and corporate trainer. He is the best-selling author of "You Were Born to Fly," a book written to inspire and give people the high-performance habits and confidence needed to be the leaders of their own destiny.

ow much do you think you're worth? A million dollars? More? Daniel Gomez told us that most people undervalue themselves, resulting in living lives that are much less than they could be.

Gomez grew up in south San Antonio where his family was so poor that instead of eating cereal with milk for breakfast, they ate their cereal with water. Hamburgers were such a luxury that he and his family would share one because that was all they had.

At the age of 18, Gomez decided life wasn't worth living any longer. He recalls that it wasn't any one event that led him to attempt suicide, but just continuing feelings that he had nothing to offer. Miraculously, he survived after firing a gun at his abdomen. The scar that resulted led to feelings of shame, guilt, and regret. When he heard a voice tell him, "Stop looking at your scar as a sign of shame; see it as a sign of grace," he understood that the scar could actually help him.

This change in thinking led Gomez to write a book, "The Millionaire Mindset." As he wrote, he prayed, and believes that the chapters were "downloaded" to him by God.

Each of us has gifts inside of us that the world needs; but we don't believe enough in ourselves. That lack of faith in ourselves is the result of a negative mindset. We've all been programmed to think a certain way. He reminded us that what we focus on expands and to have a millionaire mindset we need to change our thinking.

For example, how many of us have an "emergency" fund in case things go wrong? Instead, why not create a "freedom" fund to do something you've always wanted to do because things are going right!

Gomez reminded us that we are the president of our business, but to make God the CEO. If on a scale of 1—10 you value yourself as only a 6 your life will never go above 5. Your limitations in business and life are self-imposed.

Last, as Rotarians, we can apply the millionaire mindset to the growth and future of our club. Our failure and success is determined by everyone in this room. Who can we inspire today? Let's do it!
