hat better way to bring people together than by sharing the experience of reading the same book, then hosting discussions and presentations around it?

That's the premise of the annual "Big Read" event, sponsored by the Wichita Public Library. This is the fifteenth year for the Big Read in our community. "Can't We Talk About Something More Pleasant?" by cartoonist Roz Chast is this year's selection. The book is a memoir spanning the last few years of the lives of Chast's parents. Chast tells the story using color cartoons, family photos, and documents.

Savannah Bell, with the Wichita Public Library, said the book is based on the author's experiences as an only child dealing with her aging parents. Making it the focus of this year's Big Read provides an opportunity to discuss heavy topics in a light-hearted manner. The choice of this book was meant to spur communitywide discussion about aging, caregiving, end-oflife issues, grief, and more. You can read the ebook using your library card from March 12—April 30.

A month's worth of events, including a mini film fest and a presentation by the author, are part of the Big Read. The film fest is a collaboration with the Tallgrass Film Association. Films will be shown on Thursdays beginning on March 16 through April 13 at 5:30 p.m. at the Advanced Learning Library, 711 W. 2nd St. A film chat will follow at the Monarch.

Other featured events that are part of the Big Read include a community topic discussion with the Medical Society of Sedgwick County, StoryTime with Students, a Positive Aging Day Conference at WSU, and an Ethics Conference. Dr. Nicole Rogers, the Chair of the College of Health Professions at WSU, said the book takes a super-heavy topic—our own mortality—and makes it funny. Family caregiving touches almost everyone's life, and yet we as a society don't do a very good job of tackling the topic of serious illness.

As a partner in the Big Read, WSU is hosting events that focus on aging. Wichita artist Micala Gingrich Gaylord will gather personal items connected with memories of love from local elders. "Love is Memory" will be shown from April 1 through May 20.

The Big Read culminates in a presentation by Roz Chast on Saturday, April 15 at the WSU Metroplex, 6:00 p.m. followed by a book signing. Get your book and join the Big Read.
