# DAWN MONROE EMPOWERS US WITH POWERPOINT

ave you or your employer ever paid big money to attend a conference featuring a couple of days of speakers with impressive credentials? And yet, when you attended their presentation they pretty much read to you from their Power-Point presentation? "Where was the WOW factor I paid for?" you asked yourself.

Today's presentation was chock full of WOW factor. Entrepreneur and trainer Dawn Monroe showed us that PowerPoint is much more than text and photos projected on a screen. In doing so, she had most of us thinking about how we're going to use these new tools the next time we have to make a presentation at work.

Have you ever wanted to

show a video during your presentation? Monroe showed us how to embed videos within the Power-Point to avoid having to exit the program, log onto YouTube or another video service, and wait while the video uploads.

And if you thought Power-Point was only about visuals, know this: you can also include music, sound effects, and narration as part of your presentation. You can even synchronize a sound effect to play at the exact moment a visual appears.

Another great feature of PowerPoint is the ability to combine all the text and photos on a slide into one picture that you can insert into print material or print like a picture. Inserting several photos to create a slide show is tedious...but it doesn't have to be if you know how to use the special "Photo Album" command in PowerPoint. Within seconds you can create a photo album slide show and no one has to know how easy it was!

We'd always wondered what the "SmartArt" graphics were all about in Microsoft Office and today, Monroe showed us how to use them to take your presentation to the next level of professionalism.

A big believer in learning from videos, Monroe recommends searching for educational training videos on YouTube. She has collected her favorite PowerPoint training videos on a playlist. Check them out and add WOW to every presentation you create!
