LEARNING ABOUT THE ROBERT J. Dole VA Medical Center

Candace Ifabyi is the CEO and Medical Director of the Robert J. Dole Medical and Regional Office Center. She came to Wichita in early 2021 and is a veteran of the U.S. Army Reserve, where she worked in medical supply and logistics. Accompanying her is Jeff Herndon, Public Affairs Officer for the Center.

ou've probably passed our local VA Center many times while taking Kellogg across town. But do you know what goes on there? Today's speaker, Candace Ifabiyi, shared several interesting facts about this facility and the services it provides. Here are a few: The Center's annual operating budget is \$360 million. The Center has 81 authorized beds. It is also a teaching hospital.

Ifabiyi emphasized that the mission of the Center is to serve veterans only. The main building was finished in 1933 and saw its first patient that year. Nearly 70 years later, in 2002, the name was changed to the Robert J. Dole VA Medical Center, honoring Kansas son and U.S. Senator Bob Dole, a World War II veteran who spent many months recovering in a military hospital after receiving near-fatal injuries



from gunfire. Senator Dole, who passed away on December 5, 2021, was a staunch advocate for veterans and people with disabilities.

The Center, which is a Complexity Level 2 Medical Center, served more than 30,000 vets from 59 counties in 2020, including some Oklahoma counties. In addition, five community-based outpatient centers assist veterans in Dodge City, Hays, Hutchinson, Parsons, and Salina. Along with basic medical care the Center provides services for traumatic brain injury, homelessness, mental health care, prosthetics, orthotics, and extended care.

Something else you may not have known about our VA Center is that it offers whole health services that include classes in tai chi and diabetes management, as well as providing health coaching and massage therapy. In 2021 the Center opened a 12-bed substance abuse residential rehabilitation and treatment facility that is currently at 80% capacity. Also in 2021 the Center opened its own Oncology Department. Just four months ago the Center opened its own MRI facility.

The fastest-growing population of veterans are women who have served our country. Currently there are 7,500 female veterans in the catchment area; 2,658 are receiving services from the Center.

Currently the Center is undergoing a major construction project to upgrade its electronic medical records systems, technology throughout the Center, make the veterans' rooms more homelike, and renovate all inpatient areas. According to our speaker, the improvements will make a wonderful place for veterans even better.
