A Private School With A Public Purpose

This week's speaker was Chris English; the Head of School at *The Independent School* here in Wichita. Chris started his career in North Carolina where he taught (as luck would have it) English. In addition to teaching, Chris has dabbled in all forms of performance.

Whether it was muscials, singing, radio, or television, as he puts it, he was always "seeking attention".

But when it came right down to it, Chris found his calling in education. His knack for teaching steered him toward new, innovative, methods in teaching; namely, a 'Neurodevelopmental' approach to education. Having been exposed to training in this new approach, it only made sense that he would find a home at the Wichita school started by Jean Garvey in 1980.

The Independent School is a place where they recognize that students learn differently. They believe curriculum should be flexible and that, above all, students need encouragement and love. Others seem to agree, as next year they will celebrate 40 years of innovative education.

In his presentation, Chris shared with us the challenges of preparing students for careers that do not, yet, exist. He went over the effects of technology in education and his graphic of the Gartner Hype Cycle showed how our expectations for new technological advances may or may not always align with what those innovations actually do.

The innovation doesn't merely involve technology. There have been several advances in neurodevelopmental studies as well. Chris shared how studies of our Amygdala have helped teachers feign off boredom and understand the science behind procrastination. Their research in the field has produced a "Maslow Before You Bloom" methodology in the education community that alerts teachers to potential barriers to education for children that may be lacking basic human needs in their home life.

Above all, Chris's message highlighted the fact that "Relationships are **essential** for learning". And that the more we let Topeka make our education decisions, the less effective we will be.
