

WHAT'S NEW AT THE INTRUST BANK ARENA?

AJ Boleski is the General Manager of the INTRUST Bank Arena, Wichita's premier entertainment venue. A 20-year veteran of ASM Global, AJ and his team have also managed the Orpheum Theatre since 2013.



hat if you operated one of the top 50 entertainment venues in the U.S. and had to shut down for 18 months because of a global pandemic? That's what happened to AJ Boleski, General Manager of Wichita's INTRUST Bank Arena, which hosts 350,000 guests annually and has hosted nearly 4 million guests since opening in 2010.

The INTRUST Bank Arena (IBA) hosted Blake Shelton in March 2020. And then it closed. Today has been AJ's first opportunity to speak to groups like EWR since then.

However, the IBA didn't shut down altogether during its 18 -month closure. Many will remember that it hosted the first public COVID vaccinations last spring. But AJ and his staff are happy to announce that live shows have returned, beginning on Saturday, October 2 with the comedy group Dude Perfect, an American sports and comedy group headquartered in Frisco, TX. Former college roommates, the quintet hosts a YouTube channel with 56.7 million subscribers. After the past year and a half, it seems fitting to kick off a new season of events with a group of guys who can make us laugh.

Christian hip hop rapper and singer TobyMac is on the schedule for the following Saturday, October 9, followed by another Toby, Toby Keith, on Friday, October 15. The Wichita Thunder professional hockey team kicks off its season on Friday, October 29, and coming up in late January is ventriloquist Jeff Dunham.

Even more exciting is knowing that the IBA will host the Women's NCAA Division I Basketball Regionals from March 25-28 next spring. Looking ahead, the IBA will host the Men's NCAA Division I Basketball Regionals in 2025.

Other fun facts about Wichita's premier entertainment venue: its seating capacity for the Metallica concert was 15,690. For an NCAA basketball game the capacity is 15,004, and for most concerts it's 10,500. The lower bowl can accommodate 6,500 guests, and a theater showing will host 3,500 guests.

2020 marked the ten-year anniversary of the INTRUST Bank Arena. 890 events were held during the first ten years, hosting 3,828,676 guests, with a total of \$168 million in economic activity, or \$16.8 million annually.

What lies ahead? ASM Global, the management company that operates IBA, will begin operating Century II beginning in January 2022. Summing up his experience this past year, AJ says his goal is to keep moving forward and not go back.
