Six-year old "Benjamin" was wearing a Spiderman cap and carrying a Bible and a small homemade paper cross when he entered the mental health facility in Salina. Benjamin had already suffered significant abuse and required intensive therapy and treatment, said Fr. David Hodges, Vice-President/Chief Development Officer of St. Francis Community Services in Salina.

One of the mental health employees uttered that unfortunate, familiar phrase regarding Benjamin, "It breaks your heart."



St. Francis has been serving children and families since 1945. The services have expanded to four states: Kansas, Oklahoma, Nebraska, and Mississippi. The focus is on foster care, adoption, and family preservation.

Approximately 100,000 Kansas kids live in poverty where the next meal is unpredictable.

"That cycle of poverty is difficult to break," Fr. Hodges said. "It impacts them when

they become young adults and have families."

Fr. Hodges said the poverty often leads to kids dropping out of school and not seeking employment. Instead, the kids might choose drugs, alcohol, or become victims of sex trafficking.
