# DISCOVER ALLEN HOUSE, A KANSAS TREASURE

Sonja Vogt is a docent for the Allen House. According to dictionary.com, Docents are knowledgeable guides who conduct visitors through a museum and deliver commentary on the exhibitions. Docents are also volunteers. Sonja is both passionate and informative-someone who has truly found her calling!



ansas has only two buildings designed by Frank Lloyd Wright. Both are located here in Wichita.

Our speaker today, Sonja Vogt, told us about the house and Frank Lloyd Wright, who was recognized as the "greatest American architect of all time" by the American Institute of Architects.

The Allen House, located at 255 N. Roosevelt in College Hill, represents work from early in Wright's career, which spanned 70 years. The house represents the last of Wright's famous prairie houses, which emphasized horizontal

lines, earth tones, and a continuous blending of interiors with exteriors.

Designed for Henry and Elsie Allen, who came to Wichita in 1907 after buying the Wichita Beacon newspaper, the home was commissioned in 1916. The Allens knew William Allen White, who put them in touch with Wright. Records show that the house was completed in 1918 and sold to the Allens for about \$22,000.

In his lifetime, Wright designed more than 1,000 structures. Over 530 were completed. He referred to the Allen House as "among my best." It features a 25 by 50 foot living room that

includes more than 30 original pieces of furniture designed by Wright. The windows, all 251 of them, are original, with 88 of them designed in an art glass style. The bookshelves in the living room hold the Allen family's library collection.

The guest suite and garden house have been restored and are included in the Allen House tours, which take place throughout the week.

The house, which is owned by the Allen House Foundation, is a designated Frank Lloyd Wright historic sight. Tour and special event dates, which include a Holiday Open House in November, can be found on the website, flwrightwichita.org.

# BUT WAIT, THERE'S MORE!



Here are some more fun facts and interesting tidbits our speaker shared with us about Frank Lloyd Wright and the Allen House:

- Two of Wright's apprentices are the architects of record for Century II.
- Corbin Education Center, on the WSU campus, was designed in 1956 and completed in 1964, five years after Wright's death. It represents the other bookend of Wright's career, with the Allen House representing the first.
- Architects from all over the world come to Wichita to tour the Allen House.
- The last private owner of the house was Arthur Kincaid, who deeded the house to the WSU Endowment Association. They sold the home to the Allen House Foundation.
