MARINE GOES FROM BOOTS TO BUSINESS, OPENS LOCAL BREWERY

ance Minor knew after 21 years in the Marines that he liked the service aspect of his work. While planning his post-Marine career he also knew that if he started his own business, he didn't want to just make a profit. He wanted to make a difference.

His nephew suggested that Lance enter the craft brew business after sampling some of his home brews. Lance took a training program offered by the Marines called "Boots to Business" to learn more about becoming an entrepreneur. The planning process for his brewery began in 2012 but came to a halt when Lance contracted the H1N1 flu virus, which nearly took his life. He was in a coma and required a tracheotomy to breathe. The illness made him so weak he had to learn to walk and talk all over again.

A phrase taped to his mirror reminds him daily to hang in there and not give up. "Ever onward, never quit," it reads. Moving onward with his plan, Lance purchased a building at 117 N Handley in the Delano District in 2016 and opened the brewery last October 12. The building is divided into a 2,500 sq. ft. showroom that doubles as an art gallery, and a 9,000 sq. ft. production facility. An outdoor patio has electrical outlets so that a food truck can set up there.

While studying some lesserknown history about Wichita and Kansas, Lance saw that our history of innovation is as colorful as the wild times in the Delano District more than 100 years ago. That's when he came up with this statement that sums up Aero Plains Brewing's vision: *Our beer is brewed at the cross-roads of history and innovation, where the Chisholm Trail meets the runways of the Air Capital of the World.*

According to Lance, the local craft brew scene is more like a footrace as opposed to a hockey match. In other words, no one is trying to shove the competition into the boards. As an example of how he's lifting up other local brews, Lance put nine different beers from other Kansas breweries in their showroom to celebrate our state's birthday on (cont'd on p. 2)
