DON AND JUSTIN BAXTER PRESENT "STATE OF THE MARKETS FOR 2017"

inancial planning expertise takes years to acquire—and you never stop learning. Fortunately for us, we have years of expertise in the form of Don and Justin Baxter. Today they shared market trends in 2016 and what they could mean for investments this year.

In 2016 the S&P 500 (a stock market index that tracks the 500 most widely held stocks on the NYSE or NASDAQ) outperformed the predictions of many industry experts, who forecast 7% growth. Actual growth was 9.5%. But within those industries performance varied widely from the first half of 2016 to the second. Lesson One is: diversification of one's

portfolio is good. Also, knee -jerk reactions are NOT good; don't go chasing after the best performers. The Baxters like to "rebounce" their investment portfolios regularly to take advantage of these swings.

There are several factors that affect the markets. The labor market is one. Here in the U.S. we've had 75 straight months of growth. Unemployment has been dropping, and wages went up 2.9% last year.

The nation's Gross Domestic Product (GDP) represents the monetary value of all goods and services produced in that country over a specified period of time. Thus it is a measure of the size of a nation's economy. The United States is the world's largest economy,

followed by China. When the GDP declines for two consecutive quarters or more, by definition the economy is in a recession.

Another factor influencing the markets is energy independence. Not having to purchase oil and gas from politically unstable regions would lead to improved economic stability and increased national security.

There is a direct correlation between consumer confidence and the stock market. Higher consumer confidence leads to increased consumer spending, which helps increase the GDP.

And when is consumer confidence at a low? "When everything looks like crap," said Don.

There are two ways to imagine the future, he said. One is a positive view—industries return to the U.S., the economy takes off, and the U.S. reaches energy independence. The negative view is that the president will start a trade war, the European Union is over, and loose lending standards trigger hyper-inflation. The media experts may have a vested interest in presenting either a very positive or very negative view, so keep your perspective. The truth is, the markets are as unpredictable as the weather, but you *can* be prepared.
