Admiral Windwagon Smith was a fictitious, deranged ship captain sailing a wagon across the plains, and who better exemplifies the characteristics than past Admirals **Bob Dool** and **Rigby Carey**, joked the current Admiral, Steve Dillard. "It's so much fun, I can't begin to tell you," Steve said of being the Admiral.

Since its inception in the early 1970s, the Wichita Riverfest has become "The state's longest and largest community celebration," said Mary Beth Jarvis, CEO of Wichita Festivals. "Our charitable mission is to bring the community together and inspire unity." This year's Riverfest is from June 3-11 in and around Downtown Wichita. Riverfest unfolds thanks to nine full-time staff, 6500 volunteers, and numerous sponsors. "We are 97 1/2% privately funded," Mary Beth said. "It's not just about going and sitting watching. It's about doing." There will be 115 events this year, including 30 new ones. The economic impact is approximately \$25 million.

There were 410,000 attendees in 2015, up 35% over the past three years. Part of that increase is attributed to an emphasis on safety. In 2012, Mary Beth said, there were 156 arrests. The last few years, there have been only a few arrests per year. Another reason for the increased safety and attendance is the requirement of buttons; 97,000 were sold last year. Mary Beth said there's a similar festival in Chattanooga that charges \$64. The highest price for the Riverfest button is \$10. One of the highlights of this year's event is the Habitat for Humanity home build, which will begin and end during the festival.

"We are trying to sprinkle arts and culture throughout the festival in all sorts of ways," Mary Beth said.




