A NEW HEALTH CARE MODEL

Dr. Josh Umbehr of Atlas MD speaks with Dr. John Schlicher, EWR member and retired physician. Looking on is Jim Crawford. Dr. Umbehr, a family physician, has pioneered a new model of family medicine that eliminates the middle man in health care the insurance companies.



ealth care in the United States is a costly, and broken, system. Nearly all of us have experienced expensive increases in health insurance premiums and deductibles during the past few years.

Today's speaker, Dr. Josh Umbehr, offers a way that focuses on making health care more affordable without health insurance.

Here's how. Atlas MD, which Umbehr launched in 2010, charges a monthly membership fee for each patient. Members receive unlimited office and home visits, with same-day scheduling. In addition, Atlas MD offers medications and lab work at their cost, which is pennies on the dollar.

As an example, Umbehr

said that a patient who needed eye drops was able to purchase them for \$4 from Atlas MD. Typically they cost around \$300 at a pharmacy. A lab test which costs \$50 is \$1.65 at Atlas MD.

To Umbehr, insurance is the wrong tool for people to reach their healthcare goals. He used car insurance as a comparison. If he needs to replace his windshield wipers, he just pays for them out of pocket. It's when he has an accident that he needs to file a claim.

In a similar way, Atlas MD is a model of health care that provides coverage for many procedures as part of the monthly membership fee, which ranges from \$10 to \$100/month, depending on the client's age. These procedures include: EKG, spirometry, breathing treatments, lesion removal, cryotherapy, and body fat analysis. Atlas MD does not file insurance. To do so would require several fulltime staff. However, Umbehr advocates having health insurance to cover catastrophic events.

Although Umbehr has presented the Atlas MD model in Washington DC, it hasn't taken root there yet. He believes that physicians themselves think that the way to fix health care is by reducing the cost of health insurance premiums.

But the Atlas MD model is taking root, with strong support from Sean Hannity, of Fox News. He frequently praises the Atlas MD model. Still, widespread adoption may take awhile. As Warren Buffett said, "No matter how great the talent or efforts, some things just take time."
