Of our three speakers today, two had foreign accents but the most difficult to understand was the one from Texas. Just kidding! Talk about diversity: one of speakers was Russian and the other French.

Regardless of the speaker, the message is clear: the Wichita Area Sister Cities program brings us closer to those around the world.

The WASC President, Dr. Valentina Chappell, is Russian. Another team member, Brigitte Roussel, is French. Brigitte said there are three current WASC projects: Website enhancement; a fund-raiser at Botanica; and an information-

al booklet.

Since 1973, WASC has created relationships with four cities: Cancun, Mexico; Orleans, France: Kaifeng, China; and Tlalnepantla, Mexico.


The French connection is particularly strong, Brigitte said, because this is the 70th anniversary of a Kansas regiment liberating Orleans in World War II.

Dr. Jerry Smartt said WASC is similar to Rotary: "You have figured out how to make dreams come true," comparing our Rotary Exchange program to WASC, which sends interested parties to the Sister Cities. "You're completing

changing people. You're making global citizens."

WASC emphasizes the importance of our medical students to make a difference in other countries.

"It's not about making connections to make money," Dr. Smartt said. "It's about making connections to make relationships."
