Fire at Eden!



On September 16, a massive wildfire ran rampant through Doma. The fire was too large and fast to prevent all damage.

Difficult Realities

Every year, in Zimbabwe, between June and November, the entire countryside gets burned. Usually, we are able to burn 20 foot fire breaks and prevent the wildfires from damaging Eden's property. On September 16th, the biggest fire the ministry has ever encountered came through our area. The fire was started more than 5 miles from Eden and burned that entire distance in less than 10 minutes. The fire was started to scare lions out of the area, after they had killed some cattle. The result is that many villages, some of Eden included, went up in flames. The wind was blowing at gale force proportions that day and carried the fire over our fire guards and into grass roofed houses that went up in incredibly fast blazes. We lost the teenage girls house, both chicken houses, several kitchens and toilets and a few staff houses. Our good friend and house helper, Sainabu lost her home and most of her belongings for the second time this year! You may remember she lost her home and many belongings in March before we returned on furlough. Please pray for Sainabu as she feels she is cursed and is struggling to find hope to carry on. She isn't a born again

believer yet, so please lift Sainabu up, asking God to protect her from the cultural lies and deception of her rural cultural upbringing.

How Can You Help?

Many people have already asked what can be done to help. Primarily, pray for the people who don't know Christ and whose faith could be shaken by happenings like these. Second, the early estimates are that we've lost upwards of **\$200,000 in buildings** and possibly as much as **\$300,000 dollars in goods** (chickens, cages, clothing, beds, appliances, etc.) Those estimates are high, but we are still in the process of evaluating the damage. Please do anything you can to help, especially with the reconstruction of the staff and girls houses. We are in good spirits about the entire situation, but want to present those losses to you as accurately as possible at this time. We will share more as we learn more!
