Now, more than 30 years after its inception, Rotary Life continues and strengthens itself year after year by the talented youth it attracts. As students progress through the program, they take on increasing responsibility for designing, planning, and carrying out projects and activities. Leadership training by taking responsibility is central to the program. Another key component is using business owners, professionals, and community leaders to speak at class meetings. Students visit businesses and shadow professionals in their work environments.

And the long-lasting results? Immeasurable and life-long. Rotary Life alumni - now more than 200 strong - have moved on to become teachers, attorneys, physicians, pilots, and more. In addition to contributing through their professions, they have come to embrace Rotary's core philosophy of *"Service Above Self."* A generation later, we are proud to see Rotary Life alumni becoming Rotarians. "As much as we are teachers to our students, our students are teachers to us," said Chuck Terrell, a founder of Rotary Life. "Our youth are our best investment in our future - as a country and as a service club. And that investment comes back tenfold when they return 10 years later and say 'I want to be a Rotarian.'"
