December always fills me with so much joy because it is a season for so much goodness, a season for family and a season of love.



Taking a trip down memory lane with Rotaractor Mario Murray...

Wow! I still remember it vividly when about 15 of us squeezed into Rotarian Neal Griffith's office for what was our start-up meeting. I genuinely had no idea what I was getting myself into but I took the plunge because I was at a point in my life where I was intentionally venturing beyond my considerably shallow comfort zone. I'm struck with amazement when I consider our humble beginnings and compare them to our ever growing profile of today and I see three distinct phases emerge that coincide with our three homes thus far.



Endure, Expand, Evolve

In phase one our remit was simple; endure. Yep, we were staying the course long before Aunty Mia grabbed the reins to this nation and adopted that slogan. In those days our meetings at Trident would have about 6-12 attendees and the AC would shut off at 6pm; we had to endure. Rotaract was new to most of us so like the newborn babes we were, we crept and stumbled and tumbled in the early stages of our Rota-journey. What I love about this stage is that, as we stumbled along, our sponsor club, the Rotary Club of Barbados, gave us tremendous support and immeasurable guidance that continues even to this day. There were cascading challenges and no shortage of doubts, but the foundation of this club was laid in the steely resolve to endure.

Endured we did, and that paved the way for us to get some **G.U.T.S**. and start to expand. It was in this phase where we started to develop our own identity. We were no longer just the offspring of our sponsor Rotary club, we had become Cranberries. The growth and expansion are perfectly characterised in our transitioning around our second home, MQI. We moved from using a compact waiting area, to a showroom where we consistently filled 40 seats; with plenty of us willing to stand, because of course, we learned how to endure. It is important to recognise that we didn't just grow rapidly but sustainably. Indeed, though there are always new members being added, many of the club's official leaders and core members first sipped on the cranberry juice early in the great expansion.

We have garnered plenty recognition on this journey, culminating in the receipt of a Rotary International award for **Project of the Year**. Our flourishing has enabled us to truly make a difference in our communities, be the inspiration among our peers and, as we continue to branch out, connect the world. There has been, however, no resting on laurels or glorying in achievements but in true RaCOB fashion we continue to **go the extra mile**. And so, we find ourselves in this beautiful phase of evolution; constantly seeking ways to **#LevelUp** both ourselves and our service.

With clubs elections on the horizon I'm taken back to the time when we had candidates who won by a landslide with eyewatering 4 votes. We've come a mighty long way. The start-up group that gathered for the first time in December 2015 has birthed a club full of upstarts that has helped to transform the perception of Rotaract on a local, regional and global scale. Don't. stop. now.

ROTARY YOUTH **FORUM 2019**

SATURDAY 9TH NOVEMBER 2019

THE CRANBERRIES AND FRIENDS assembled at the Post-Graduate Studies Complex of the University of the West Indies, Cave Hill Campus for the 4th Annual Rotary Youth Forum.

Topic 1: In A Nutshell – Rotary Themes and Structure

This session acted as training for Rotaractors and Prospective Members on Rotary's history, the structure of District 7030 and the role of Rotary and the District in the club's yearly goals. Led by Past District Governor David Edwards, participants took full advantage of the question and answer segment raising concerns about Rotary International's recent policy change, which removes the upper age limit for membership in Rotaract, effective July 2020. Topic 2: Effective Communication

Back by popular demand, Ms. Marjorie Wharton provided attendees with tools for effective communication within the workplace and or voluntary organizations. Some key takeaways were to understand that perception influences communication and that both the sender and receiver has equally important roles for communication to be effective.

Topic 3: Dress for Success

This was led by Rotaractor Crystal Waithe and provided participants with advice on dressing for the workplace and professional events. This was in the form of a fashion show under the following categories:

- Business Wear Outfits appropriate for work
- *Rota-Fit* Outfits appropriate for Rotary/Rotaract Formal Events (e.g. Signature and Handing Over)
- Borderline Outfits that may be inappropriate for work based on your office culture
- *Oh, Hell No!* Outfits that are inappropriate for any professional setting

November marked *Entrepreneurship Month* and the Professional Development Committee decided to foster the entrepreneurship spirit in our members by hosting Pass the Mic: Entrepreneurship Edition. The event was moderated by Rtr. Kiana Chewitt who led our three panelists, Mrs. Cardell Fergusson from the Barbados Youth Business Trust, Rtn. Malcolm Vaughn and YSD Makonem Hurley, through an eyeopening discussion on what it takes to be an entrepreneur. Here are some of the key takeaways:

Do your research- Decide on a niche and investigate what you need to make this business a success.

Know Your Why- What made you go into the particular field of business?

Use Your Network- Don't be afraid of telling your family and friends about your idea. They may know someone who knows someone who could help get your business get off the ground.

The Legal Stuff- Go to CAIPO to register your business. Know the different types of businesses – sole proprietorship, partnership, limited liability company, corporation etc. - and which one suits the needs of your business best. Also take note of the fees and taxes associated with each.

Delegate- Don't try to do it all and don't be afraid to ask for help.

Be An Expert- You should know your field well. Keep up to date on new products or services in your industry.

Get Help- Contact The Barbados Youth Business Trust for guidance on getting your business up and running. Their assistance includes start-up capital, business mentoring, networking, advisory and marketing support to name a few.

Ever wanted to experience a "White Christmas" but can't stand the cold? Well, say less!


The Club Service Committee presents: Christmas Tree -The Winter Wonderland Edition.


