



# TOQUES FINALES

On Saturday, April 24th, 2021, we commenced 'Toques Finales' (Final Touches), an initiative engendered by the Community Service Committee to enhance the beautification of the Grounds at the Luther Thorne Memorial School. The objective was to restore the School's garden and construct a wooden pallet fence as a protective barrier around the garden. 3 Cranberry teams were mobilized for the execution of this exercise.

Team 1 got the ball rolling on Saturday, April 24th, with the majority of the groundwork ensuing. After some heavy lifting by DE Chevon Graham, the wooden pallets were ably cleaned, washed and primed (treated). Concurrently, the 2nd half of the team was preparing the plant beds with the manure (and some ash) to facilitate the later planting of seedlings.

The following day, the Painters stormed in and quickly took to the brushes and cans to complete a pearly white finish on the pallets. The fellowship, of course, was not to be forgotten as **Dir. Kavita Singh** brought the music vibes via Spotify and, in true Cranberry fashion, **Rtr. Zahir Jackson** sang and danced as he dipped and brushed. Yes, we all joined in on the act...

On the morning of the final day, May 8th, the fence was assembled and erected by our very helpful carpenter, Rodney, under the strict supervision of **CS** Cherise Vanderpool, aka 'The Foreman'. In the evening, the Planting team assembled and got to work in the dirt with the assistance of guest Omar, who lent us his planting expertise and ensured the seedlings were planted in the right groupings with the right spacings as we made the final touches to the plant beds.

As the dust and ash settled, we stood and watched over the newly restored garden enclosed by the white 'picket' fence. What a sight to behold! Now for the children to reap what we sowed!


