Summary of the RCOB Meeting Held on May 25th. 2023

The 37th meeting of the Rotary year 2022-23 was called to order at 12.30pm.

President Tracey asked for the singing of the national anthem, followed by a toast to her Excellency the President of Barbados.

President Tracey welcomed PP Stanley MacDonald to receive his Paul Harris fellow +5.

President Tracey invited Rotarian Keri to lead off the Tools of the Trade session. This is the second panel discussion in our social leadership series.

Alison Browne-Ellis, PP Paul Ashby and PP Algie Leacock were welcomed and introduced to the club to start the discussion.

Alison gave a brief of her background and what led her to be CEO of Payce Digital and the invitation to apply being a sign from GOD, followed by PP Paul giving insights into how he became the CEO of Signia and his journey from CIBC and the lessons learned along the way. PP Algie spoke about leaving his job, asking the bank to give him some time off on his mortgage and then being asked to take on the role of VP at Trident and then later CEO. Alison spoke of her growth and told her past self to own her value, she felt that women should stand up and realize what they bring to the table and the confidence she feels when she sits in a board room and now represents herself more. PP Paul stated that he would not do anything differently. Over the course of his career, he has been very fortunate and had lots of opportunities from 6 months in, being asked to lead the activities committee. Being a member of JC's and the things learnt there and now sitting in board rooms and not being intimidated. He learnt a lot from JC's and thinks that you should expand beyond your core duties.

The question was asked regarding advice to give to Gen Z and millennials. It was acknowledged that they are very different in their mindset and how they approach work and what they want out of it. Mentoring was suggested as a solution while understanding their differences. Competence needs to be built up but millennials and Gen Z do not want to stick around long enough to learn and develop. PP Algie gave the example of his son and not wanting to work as hard and as long but now talks of being worked to the bone. That you should learn while working so you develop.

PP Stanley and PP Vic spoke on their views and gave insights from their perspectives. Questions were taken from the floor.

All Rotarians commended the session, they found it very informative.

Pres Tracey asked Rtn. Chrispin to give the vote of thanks and he reiterated the view that the session was fantastic.

President Tracey adjourned the meeting.


