Acting SAA Rtn Meryl introduced our guest speaker Octavia Gibson Deputy Director, Currency Section - Central Bank of Barbados, who is highly trained in counterfeit detection and prevention and n the skill of designing bank notes.

Ms Gibson supported by her team which included Mr. Alvon Moore, Senior Operations Officer – Currency Section, Ms Janette Carter Admin Assistant Currency Services and Mr. Marlon White, Security Officer, taught the Club what to look out for in order to establish authenticity of local currency and enlightened us on the many enhanced features of the Barbados currency which are aimed at preventing counterfeiting. The presentation was very nteractive, members were allowed to inspect specimen currency using magnifying glasses and blue lights, and compare the former with the enhanced currency. Although money passes through our nands every day there is so much about the currency that most of us were unaware of. For example, did you know that just below the denomination on the new bills there are dots which are designed to assist the visually impaired? Did you know that at the back of each bill there is a building which is directly related to the ndividual whose likeness is at the front of the bill? Club members were very enthusiastic and asked several questions such as: what s the procedure followed when counterfeit currency is detected? PP Eriskine in his vote of thanks thanked Ms Gibson and her team for the very timely presentation and joked about the use of a piscuit tin under one's bed as an alternative means of banking and keeping currency safe.

World Polio Day lauds historic partnership, success

OCTOBER 24 WAS WORLD POLIO DAY

ROTARY AND GLOBAL POLIO ERADICATION INITIATIVE (GPEI) HAVE PUT POLIO ON THE BRINK OF GLOBAL ERADICATION

Thirty years ago, the paralyzing disease affected 350,000 children in one year. Because of massive vaccination campaigns around the world, cases have dropped more than 99.9 percent, to only 20 reported so far this year. Polio, which was endemic in 125 countries in 1988, now remains so in just three: Afghanistan, Nigeria, and Pakistan. More than 2.5 billion children have been vaccinated, and more than \$14 billion has been invested in the fight to eradicate the disease worldwide.

The GPEI has trained and mobilized millions of volunteers and health workers, gained access to homes not reached by other health initiatives to immunize children, brought health interventions to underserved communities, and standardized timely global monitoring for polio cases and poliovirus, a process also known as surveillance.

In Pakistan and Afghanistan, where there are still polio cases, there are tremendous challenges related to conflict and insecurity, yet the brave polio workers go to these insecure areas to vaccinate children.

Rotary has contributed more than \$1.8 billion to polio eradication since it started its PolioPlus program in 1985. The effort got a boost in August when Rotary announced it would provide an additional \$96.5 million in grants to increase immunizations and surveillance. Most of the funds were allocated to the three countries where polio remains endemic; Afghanistan (\$22.9 million), Nigeria (\$16.1 million), and Pakistan (\$21.7 million). The rest was spread across 12 countries in Africa that are vulnerable to polio.

Rotary has also committed to raising \$50 million a year over a three -year period for eradication activities. The Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation will match up to that amount 2-to-1, which could bring the total as high as \$450 million.
