For those of you who were unable to attend, below are our awardees for this year's POW

SHAREKA BENTHAM—FOUNDER OF EASY SPEAK SER-

VICES Shareka is a Commonwealth Scholar whose first degree is in psychology. Starting her private practice Easyspeak Enterprises seven years ago, Shareka has made aural rehabilitation for children with cochlear implants fun and a great experience by creating an app for the Apple iPad for speech therapy.

KAMILLE MARTINDALE - FOUNDER OF UNBORN JUS-

TICE This is a pro-life group catering especially to teenagers. On April 10th, 2017, Unborn Justice opened the doors to Barbados' first pregnancy resource centre. Services offered at the centre include free pregnancy testing, counselling, client empowerment programmes, tangible support, free CXC programmes, public education and post-abortive healing.

DALE TROTMAN— FOUNDER OF MedRegis Dale focused on health care, as it was still based on paper records and manual recording in Barbados. He started to develop a suite of mobile applications for health-care workers designed to help them record, store and share patient information in a digital form. The apps, called <u>MedRegis</u>, are used from the check-in process to check-out.

TROY WEEKES—NATIONAL DEVELOPMENT SCHOLAR and LEAD DESIGNER OF CROP GUARD

This is a social network geared towards agriculture. It includes an easy to use interface where farmers can communicate with extension officers as well as each other by posting pest pictures and listings, disease diagnoses, maps, links to relevant information and more. His app will also be instrumental in thwarting the increasing levels of crop theft on the island.

OUR GUEST SPEAKER—MRS. KRYSTLE HOWELL, CPA, CIA, ALMI, ACS

Krystle, a Millennial herself, gave a thought provoking speech on passing the economic and social baton from Generation X to the Millennials. She discussed the current economic and social climate in which the Millennials are working and living and the fact that the Millennial tends to be solution driven given the resources available to them including the access to education from multiple sources. The address, notwithstanding its gravity, was positive and the message one of hope and conviction.

Thank you, Krystle, for addressing us and for allowing us to reflect on our own problem solving abilities and the fact that all generations can learn and benefit from the other.
