



Summary of the Joint Club Meeting Held on October 24th, 2023

The meeting began positively, recognizing its historical significance due to the collaborative efforts of the Rotary and Rotaract Clubs of Barbados. This occasion was regarded as a celebratory evening, coinciding with World Polio Day.

- **Opening Prayer** by Rotarian Joe Johnson marked the commencement of the meeting, setting a reflective tone for the event.

- President Gale Reeves of the Rotary Club of Barbados West extended the welcome, expressing the Club's dedication to shared values and an unwavering passion for pooling strengths to transcend boundaries in our collective efforts on the ground towards eradicating polio. - A musical Tribute was done my Miracle Rice from the Barbados Community College
- President Marcel Murrell from the Rotary Club of Barbados South provided an overview of the historical perspective of polio, highlighting that among the three strains of the disease, two have been eradicated, leaving only one strain in existence. Additionally, President Murrell also conveyed information from Rotary International, an organization with 1.2 million members across more than 200 countries, which spearheaded the initiatives to eliminate polio back in 1988. - President Ermine Darroux-Francis discussed the current status of the fight against Polio. She began by emphasizing the objective of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, aiming to prevent any child from being paralyzed by any strain of the Polio virus. Additionally, she highlighted the ongoing meetings of the International Health Regulations Emergency Committee held every three months. The presentation also revealed that there are currently two genetic clusters of the Polio virus Type 1, a decrease from three identified in 2022 and five in 2021. 


OBJECT OF ROTARY
