President Robin asked PP. Norman (*pictured right*) to deliver today's Prayer



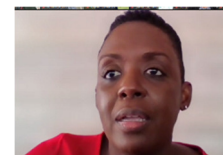
Sergeant at Arms Randy introduced visitors and welcomed visiting Rotarians.

Rev Dr, John Rogers (*pictured right*) spoke on the role of religion in Barbados. It started with colonization and the planters. On reaching Barbados the colonizers spread their religion. The indigenous people never carried their religion forward, but the small Jewish community were able to maintain their religious practices.



The Anglican church was the Church of the state and were most influential in the proliferation of schools in Barbados. Christians played a role in shaping society and molding families.

Initially slaves were not considered human, and they were not introduced to religion. However later religion was used to indoctrinate the slaves. Religion still governs the lives of people

The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and in particular to encourage and foster:
