
He was a member in his native St. Vincent and the Grenadines in 2001; where he held the position of Secretary-Elect before coming to Barbados.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE FELLOWSHIP MEETING WHICH INCLUDED A GUEST SPEAKER & INSTALLATION OF A NEW MEMBER- FEBRUARY 28, 2016

Last Thursday, February 25, Barbados' Ambassador to Caricom H.E. The Hon Robert Morris addressed the Club on the topic "Barbados Past, Present and Future." PP Erskine introduced him and Rotarian Freddie Hart gave the Vote of Thanks.

Following is a Summary of the Presentation by Ambassador Morris.

Ambassador Morris restated a question which had been asked "How could a vulnerable land state, ravaged by devastating hurricanes in the 18th, 19th and 20th centuries, with a history of slavery and a monocrop economy for over 350 years, emerging into democracy just over 65 years ago, and into Independence just 50 years, command such respect in the global community as is constantly recorded in the Human Development Index?"



He spoke to the development of Barbados in comparison to our better endowed regional neighbours with larger populations and superior natural resources. This in his view should "affirm our confidence, that in the roller coaster of human development, with its swings and shift, we should be proud of where we have come from, proud of where we are, and confident in assuring our people, especially our children that we are confident

of our future, as we celebrate 50 years of Independence."

Confident but not complacent, as we face our achievements, and our challenges, with fortitude and commitment, as we pursue a vision and a mission, to which we all commit ourselves as citizens of this country."

He reflected on our colonial past which was "tainted by the horrible experience of chattel slavery." Further he indicated that he has continued to argue that "we have not moved sufficiently to heal the divisions in our society."

He revealed that "For that I have been called racist by some, for others I have been supported for posing an alternative view."

"Today I wish to repeat that Barbados benefited in the colonial era from the fact that we were settled by families of the gentry class in England. There are still representatives of those families in Barbados, who recognise themselves as Barbadians and who make valuable contributions to our country."

Further he stated that "It is certainly not my intention to glorify the colonial past, or in any way support the iniquitous system of slavery. But I wish to emphasise that there is much work to be done, not just in validating Bussa, Franklin and the free coloureds who gave leadership to the 1816 rebellion which shook the foundations of slavery, and whose 200th Anniversary we celebrate today, or the leaders of the 1876 or of 1937.

"By the 1980's we were being celebrated all over the world for punching above our weight. The transformation achieved by economic diversification into light manufacturing, tourism, offshore banking and financial services, driven by local entrepreneurship with international partnership, and aided by massive state support in infrastructural, super structural, legislative, bureaucratic, technical and other support, had propelled us to my position where we were to be graduated to being more than a middle income country, and considered to be on the brink of being a first world country."

He concludes by stating "I do not pretend to be a seer, or a prophet. My frame for this discussion, my point of view, and my narrative is based on the perception that change is a constant and a necessity. It is also based on the premise that, except in colonial and tyrannical environments, evolution is preferable to revolution, except for the revolution of the mind and the expansion of free thought and innovation."

I see the Social partnership as a base for encouraging true integration in our society, without the polarization that comes from ethnicity, racism or classism. We must all clearly understand what it is to be BARBADIAN, A BIM, a BAJAN. We who are here came from many continents to make this gem what it is. WE need more to understand our global origins as we continue to make our way in the global world."
