SUMMARY OF THE BUSINESS MEETING HELD ON FEBRUARY 24, 2022

- President Robin called the 32nd meeting of the Rotary Year to order at 12:30 p.m. This was followed by the National Anthem and Toast to the President of Barbados.
- SAA Randy delivered the prayer.
- Hon Rotarian, visiting Rotarians and guests were introduced (see details on P2a). Pres Robin also welcomed his PIS, Dr Deanne Ford, to the meeting
- Pres Robin announced customary birthdays and anniversaries (see P4a)
- Rtn Chrispen presented the Rotary Minute which was centred on the telegram from Paul Harris requesting that funds be raise through The Rotary Foundation (details of the Rotary [Foundation] Minute may be found on P3b)
- The guest speaker, Mr Ronald Pope, was introduced by Rtn Nigel Pierre who will speak to the topic: 'Why Suicide?'
- Some facts about suicide:
 - Globally more than 700,000 die due to suicide annually: more men commit suicide than women, whereas more women attempt suicide than men
 - ◆ A prior suicide attempt is the single most important risk factor for suicide in the general population
 - ♦ Suicide is the 4th leading cause of death among 15 to 19 year olds
 - ♦ 77% of global suicides occur in low- and middle-income countries
 - Ingestion of pesticides, hanging and firearms are the most common methods used for suicide globally
- Persons who are at risk:
 - ♦ Someone who has an underlying psychiatric disorder such as major depression, post-traumatic stress disorder or bipolar disorder
 - ♦ Someone who has a family history of mental disorders, substance abuse, suicide or violence, including physical or sexual abuse
 - An individual who has a medical condition that can be linked to depression and suicidal thinking, such as chronic disease, chronic pain or terminal illness
 - Lesbian, gay, bisexual or transgender individuals with an unsupportive family or in a hostile environment
 - ♦ Someone who attempted suicide before
 - Feelings of hopelessness, worthlessness, easily agitated, socially isolated or lonely
 - ◆ Someone who has experienced a stressful life event, such as the loss of a loved one, a breakup, or serious financial or legal problems
 - ♦ Someone who has a substance abuse problem: alcohol and drug abuse can worsen thoughts of suicide and make the person feel reckless or impulsive enough to act on their thoughts
 - Someone who has suicidal thoughts and access to firearms in their home or surroundings
- A very lively and interactive session ensued with some very insightful comments and observations made by PIS Dr Deanne Ford

ROTARY FOUNDATION MINUTE





Below is an except from a telegram dated 31January1947, in which Paul Harris requested that funds be raised for Rotary Foundation.

It speaks to an historical date 23rd February 1947 (the day before our meeting) where the foundation raised funds for Paul Harris after he passed

away. Paul Harris requested no flowers etc. but instead for funds to be raised:

Please see below an excerpt from the telegram dated 31 January 1947.

"Board Directors last week agreed comply immediately mandate 1938 Rotary Convention to raise two million dollars for Rotary Foundation. Paul Harris had expressed hope that instead of funeral flowers money might be sent to foundation for furthering international understanding.......will you immediately contact each of your clubs by telegraph or telephone at expense Rotary International urging this appeal to carry out 1938 convention mandate so that by 42nd anniversary on February 23rd fun night be well under way in memory of Paul Harris and surely accomplished by San Francisco Convention......"
