

BILL& MELINDA GATES foundation

October is Polio Awareness Month...and having just celebrated World Polio Day on Monday Oct 24th, we continue this week with our final Polio Awareness Update!

DID YOU KNOW

- On Oct 18, 2022, Rotary International and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation announced a renewed fundraising partnership to eradicate polio?
- This Partnership will infuse an additional US\$450 million into the global polio eradication effort.
- Rotary is committed to raising \$50 million per year over the next three years, with every dollar to be matched with two additional dollars from the Gates Foundation. This expanded agreement will translate into up to a total of \$450 million to support the Global Polio Eradication Initiative.
- The Rotary Foundation Board of Trustees recently approved a \$50 million grant for AFRO surveillance, Afghanistan, Pakistan and Outbreak Response. These grants will support ongoing immunization activities to reach children under the age of five with an emphasis on improving community awareness and engagement—promoting vaccine acceptance, reducing the number of missed children—and ensuring robust surveillance capacity to quickly detect poliovirus transmission
- While only Afghanistan and Pakistan continue to report cases of wild poliovirus, the remaining challenges to global eradication—like difficulty reaching children amid insecurity and conflict and weak health systems—have proven to be the most difficult
- With an annual contribution of US\$100 we can support the Polio Eradication Countdown to History by becoming a member of the *District 7030 PolioPlus Society*?



Did you know....

In her statement on signing the Bill & Melinda Gates agreement, RI President Jennifer Jones said: *"As the first organization* to envision a polio-free world, Rotary is more committed than ever to delivering on our *promise that one day, no child will ever again be paralyzed by polio,"*.

FIRST: The development of acquaintance as an opportunity of service;


