Summary of the RCOB Meeting Held on March 28th, 2024

- National Anthem was sung and Rotary Grace recited by the club members.
- Sergeant-at-arms Heather introduced the guests at the Hilton.
- President Ermine thanked Rotarian Karen and PP Denise for their work with Earlyact and Rotarian Nicholas for his work with Interact.

Director Neal Griffith - Paul Harris Fellow +7

- Director Neal was pinned as Paul Harris Fellow +7 and is now among the top 5 highest level PHFs in our club (based on active membership)
- Dir. Neal provided information to the club on the Fund and what inspires him to donate.
- An appeal was made to the club to contribute to the fund, currently only 28 of our members have donated for the Rotary year and we have a goal of at least 60.
- We have surpassed our target of \$10,000 donations with a current state of \$10,772 and we were challenged to make it \$12,000 with just about 3 months left within our Rotary year.

- Rotarian Nicholas provided an overview of the great work being actioned by the 3 Interact groups and thanks PP Stanley for his continued support with the Interact groups.
- St. Michael School group currently has a School Assistance Program underway where they donate to 9 families in need. There may be a need for Rotarian support to help the cause, and more details will be shared next week. Their elections were held on 27th March.

However, they did host a session during International Women's Month on influential women and is working through a School Assistance Program with the Guidance Counselor at the school. 


