# RESPONDING TO EDUCATIONAL NEEDS IN A COVID-19 ENVI-RONMENT, CONT'D

The Ministry of Education learned much during the lockdown:

- They were forced from March 2020 into Emergency Learning, Learning new programs for delivery
- Online Learning/Blended Learning

   for all concerned, Teachers, Parents and pupils. Google suite
- Changes to the 11+ and CXC
- Challenges teachers and pupils without adequate WiFi and some without electricity. Tackling the Digital Divide
- · Challenges with Social Distancing
- Adequately supporting Special Needs pupils

Planning to return to School in January– The December spike caused a change in plan. Consultation with Unions, Teachers, Parents, Pupils and the Ministry of Health were necessary to chart a way forward. The Role of the PTA became even more critical.

# With the school on lockdown, who is using the schools?

Some Teachers who would not have a quiet space at home will use the schools. Pupils who do not have WiFi at home are able to use the schools. Ancillary Staff are required to keep the plant clean.

## Is there any chance to determine the students in need?

Student Support Services has a database which is updated daily to identify those in need.

# The Learning Curve and Adaptation—what about social interaction—how will virtual learning impact?

There will be impact on the pupils. It also impacts the Teachers. At the commencement of the class there is a time for virtual social interaction. School is a social place.

How are the Technical Schools and Practical Sessions being catered to? Students were allowed to come in to have their practical sessions. This would include SJPPI, Sciences and even needlework.

#### What about the 11+?

The dates have been extended. A survey will be done to determine the level at which the pupils are. However the Ministry is in control of the setting of these dates.
