RECAP OF OUR BI-ANNUAL CLUB FORUM HELD SEP. 29, 2018

The September 2018 Club Forum was a success. It was full of positive ideas, constructive discussion and active discussion. If a title were to be given for this meeting it would be

"OUR CLUB; OUR PROJECTS; OUR YOUTH; OUR IDEAS; OUR FUTURE!"

At this meeting, those present discussed different topics ranging from new fund raising activities to the possibility of having a meeting a month to allow the young working and hard working Rotaractors to join us for fellowship on a Thursday. The participation of the Rotaractors of our two Rotaract Clubs was priceless and very appreciated.

The blend of thought ranging from young to old and from computer savvy to paper savvy was also priceless as it allowed us a Club to suggest ideas spanning all generations and the different communication modalities.

Ways to improve our contribution to the sporting world and the development of young people were put to the Club by Director Adrian in his report who stressed the importance of the RCoB promoting a healthy community for the benefit of all including but not limited to our young people.

Director Tracey impressed upon the positives of good PR and the fact that good PR is credible and builds trust in the public's eye. Good PR requires a visible approach in the media which acts as the marketing tool for promoting the work of the Club.

Director Tracey stated the following key suggesting for the RCoB PR Programme namely

- Ensure that our PR is highly focussed around our projects
- Ensure that there is more visibility for our Corporate sponsors and partners through dedicated media briefings and site visits
- Have more action shots of Rotarians working as well as the usual fellowship shots. In this she continued to be mindful of the "Service above Self" motto which guides all Rotarians.
- Work more closely with the other PR directors on joint events
- Prepare releases whenever we invite the media to the Club
- Effective use of social media and ensuring that there is simultaneous placement on website and social media of all releases.

Director Makonem gave a passionate presentation on the work of the Rotaract Clubs and presented ideas to the Club to foster a joint interact project between the two Interact Clubs.

Director Makonem's presentation underscored the vibrancy of the junior clubs and the continued collaboration between RCoB and its junior clubs which together are making positive change in our society.

President Elect Peter was also a motivational speaker as he suggested new avenues for service above self for consideration by the Club including contribution to the blood bank and assistance to kidney donors and or transplants.

He also explored other avenues of fund raising, coupling his presentations with well researched spread sheets of income and expenditure for further consideration by the Club and its Board of Directors.

Director Michael in a comprehensive brief again commented on the bulletin which continues to be well received. Additionally he provided the Club with the list of upcoming activities for the Rotary year. However, Director Michael expressed concern for the following:

- Rotarians whose attendance is less than 30%
- The level of late attendance to the weekly meetings

This list of activities was shared by him via email and WhatsApp for ease of reference.


