


Following is a Summary of the presentation by Dr. Alleyne

BULLYING-

Definition:

- The act of intimidating a weaker person to make them do something. (Webster Dictionary)
- The abuse of power to hurt somebody physically <u>OR</u> emotionally.

Note Abraham Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs on "Self Actualisation"



WHY TARGET BULLYING?

20% of youth will develop mental health disorders by age

50% of mental disorders will commence by adolescence. Severe life stressors cause the expression of mental illness.

Bullying is one of the most severe childhood stressors.

(WHO ATLAS STUDY) BULLYING-EPIDEMIOLOGY

Boys (8.6% - 45.2%), Girls (4.8% - 35.8%) (*Craig et al 2009*)

% of students who were bullied on one or more days during the past 30 days

Boys (12.1%-19.4%), Girls(8.5%-14.1%)

PROFILES IN COMMUNITY SERVICE -#10—PAST DISTRICT GOVERNOR, DAVID EDWARDS, PHF.



With a prolific career in Rotary locally, regionally and internationally, PDG David Edwards has been described as "the most sought after, relied upon and respected Rotarian locally and regionally1. He was introduced by Robert O. Bobby Morris to the Rotary Club of Grenada East, became a member on April 11 1978 and as the saying goes "he never looked back". He became a member in the Rotary Club of Barbados in May 1979 and

became President of the Rotary Club of Barbados in the year 1991.

The project spearheaded in the year of his Presidency was the construction and furnishing of the Respite Care Centre at the Barbados Association for Children with Intellectual Challenges, formerly the Barbados Association for Mentally Retarded Children. This respite unit was the first of its kind in Barbados; it offers a valuable service to parents caring for a child with disabilities allowing parents to leave their children for up to one month so that they (parents) can have some time for themselves. The project ran smoothly as Barbados businesses and individuals readily lent assistance through the provision of materials free of cost or at a substantially reduced cost or through financial donations. PDG David is said to have been the carpenter, mason and painter for the project together with other members of the Club. The structure was built at a cost of \$50,000.00. The official ceremony was attended by Sir Hugh Springer and Dame Nita Barrow. Along with fellow Rotarian Horace King, PDG David served on the Board of the Challenor Home for several years.

For the period 2004-05, PDG David served as the District Governor for District 7030, with official responsibility for the 69 clubs in that District. The arrival of Hurricane Ivan² in September 2004 however, two months after taking up his appointment caused a major shift in his strategic plan for that year from HIV/AIDS awareness to Grenada recovery. The devestation in Grenada was so great that PDG David on travelling to Grenada in one of the first planes to arrive there after the Hurricane noted that there was no air traffic control, "we had to look to see where to land."

PROFILES IN COMMUNITY SERVICE -#10 (CONT'D)

Efforts towards Grenada's recovery included:

- a radiothon that raised in excess of 1 million dollars in association with PP Vic Fernandes (Starcom Network Inc.);
- food and clothing drives;
- money collection from local and regional clubs;
- shipping of various supplies to Grenadian Rotarians who arranged local distribution;
- contribution towards the restoration of the St. Joseph Convent;
- organisation of fishing and regular boats and planes to transport relief supplies coordinated by PP Roger Smith.

PDG David wishes again to thank all those that lent support including all members of the Rotary Clubs of Barbados who provided yeoman service coming to the rescue of their neighbours.

PDG David having lived in Grenada, is considered by some an Honorary Grenadian, and was deeply affected by the devastation to the St. Joseph's Convent having previously lived in close proximity to it. His most heartwarming moment as PDG was the handing over of the Convent to the nuns, teachers and children after the restoration.

The crisis in Grenada prevented PDG David from accomplishing all that he wished during his District Governor year. However, among the accomplishments of PDG David that year was the opening of an AIDS screening and detection Centre in Paramaribo, Suriname opened at the Diakonessenhuis Hospital.

Another moment of pride and highlight for PDG David was the attendance of over 200 Rotarians from District 7030 at the Rotary International Convention in Chicago, 2005 which marked Rotary's 100th year; the centennial year coinciding with his year as District Governor. He has been especially commended for his work with the Rotary Foundation and his demonstration to members the ways in which we as Rotarians can contribute to the Foundation.

PDG David has been chosen as Aide to 3 RI Presidents, served on several occasions on the Zone Executive³ and attended the Council of Legislation 2013. He is currently serving as an Assistant Regional Rotary Foundation Coordinator for Zone 34. He is a Paul Harris Fellow and recipient of the Rotary Foundation Citation for Meritorious Service award as well as the Rotary International Service above Self Award. This Rotary International Service above Self Award was presented in Barbados by RI President Kalyan Banerjee.

In addition to his former banking experience, PDG David is the Principal of DD Construction Ltd and its subsidiary Palm Real Estate. He is a member of the Barbados Estate Agents and Valuers Association. He is a past Director of the Barbados Hotel and Tourism Association, and a Trustee and former Chairman of the Barbados Rally Club. A Justice of the Peace, he is also a former Chairman of the GAIA Inc, which owns and operates the Grantley Adams International Airport, Barbados. He is married to Donna, also a Paul Harris Fellow. They have two children and three grandchildren.

Part of PDG David's vision for the future of the Club is the expansion of the Club's penchant for smaller projects through community work...for example; painting the homes of the less fortunate and elderly persons. He proffers that these types of projects demonstrate to others the principles that Rotary espouses without advertisement and tremendously improve motivation and fellowship.

As he puts it "If I see you in the Club, I may not know you...but put painting a house on a Saturday and some fellowship afterwardsyou can get to know a member".

^[2] Hurricane Ivan was a large, long-lived, Cape Verde-type hurricane that caused widespread damage in the Caribbean and United States. The cyclone was the ninth named storm, the sixth hurricane and the fourth major hurricane of the active 2004 Atlantic hurricane season. Ivan formed in early September, had reached Category 5 strength on the Saffir-Simpson Hurricane Scale, and became the 10th most intense Atlantic hurricane ever recorded. At its peak in the Gulf of Mexico, Ivan was the size of the state of Texas. It also spawned 119 tornadoes across the eastern United States. Ivan caused catastrophic damage to Grenada as a strong Category 3 storm.
