

- In 1936 Rotary Clubs organized Institutes for the International Understanding of Global Issues?
  - · Via these Institutes Clubs and Communities were addressed by prominent persons on issues such as the economy, world peace, life beyond borders and scientific advances.
  - The Clubs arranged the local institutes and the Foundation helped pay for speakers' expenses beyond what clubs could
