Summary Minutes of the RCOB Meeting Held on November 28th, 2024

Greetings were also extended to PP Robin's Guests, PIS Diane and daughter Neysa.

Lively discussion characterized the Buffet style lunch. PP Robin introduced the Guest Speaker, Mrs. Iro Smith, whom he met at the Rotary Convention in Texas, USA. The Magic of Rotary was the catalyst for a friendship that took his family to Greece and has blossomed into a visit to Barbados by the Smiths as his Guests.



Guest Speaker, Mrs. Iro Smith is a certified professional esthetician, makeup artist and Permanent make-up artist with studies in Greece, Paris, the Far East, and USA. She is known for her presentations at many conferences and exhibitions around the world. As Owner – Director – Trainer, she has been practicing the art of permanent make-up since 1990 in co-operation with dermatologists and plastic surgeons with whom she provides expert advice and medical corrections.

In a lively and interesting presentation Mrs. Smith explained that Permanent Make-up (also known as micro-pigmentation) is the micro-implantation of pigment / colour into the skin (epidermis) of eyebrows, eyelines, lip lines, etc. medically developed and specially designed for a safe and permanent application.

In an interesting Q and A session her effervescent personality was evident as she expanded on the applications of her “Wake-up to Make-up” project. The technique is used for both men and women in cases such as making men look younger, alopecia, vitiligo, scalp pigmentation, balding, etc.

Rotarian Davina in moving the Vote of Thanks expressed the appreciation of the club for education in this area of her vocation and thanked Mrs. Smith for sharing lunch and her special expertise with the RCOB.
