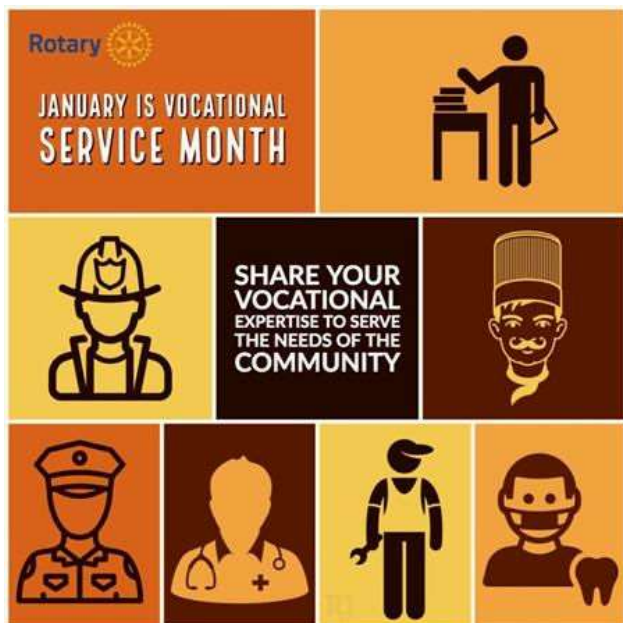

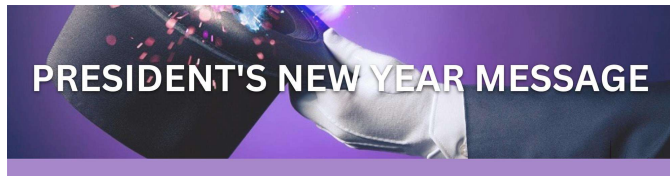
RCoB welcomed three new members into our Rotary family in the first half of the year.

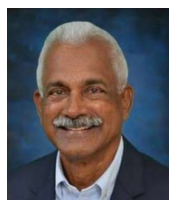
Fellow Rotarians as we enter a New Year, I wish to extend sincere thanks to all Rotarians who truly exemplified our motto service above self.
