Rotary Classification Talk — By Rtn. Nigel Pierre

I started at The Mutual as a Programmer/Analyst and worked my way up to IT architect and finally to my current role of Compliance Architect. I was always intrigued by computers and started writing a game in BASIC (Commodore 64) at 14. I loved



playing around and tinkering with circuit boards and computers. At my current company, I loved the idea of building systems that assist others with their work, in fact one system is still in use at Sagicor, 21 years later. For me that is rewarding, solving problems has always been something I am keen to do. It can be challenging, but I do love knowing there is a problem to solve. The biggest hurdle I face is the personality issues that come with the area.

One of the challenges of being in the compliance field centers around audits, there is usually very little warning and no margin for error, accuracy and thoroughness are paramount. Being new to Rotary and its emphasis on character, professionalism, it would further develop/enhance those areas that are very important in my career. My department is a service-oriented unit - Shared Services IT, where service is paramount and one of the objectives of Rotary.


To be successful in my career, you must be meticulous, logic minded, a problem-solver and very dedicated. I am very passionate about my field.

As for outside forces, constant changes in legislation - GDPR, AML/ KYC, data privacy, require constant adapting to change as it affects the business landscape and with more legislation coming - CCPR (California) there is a constant need to keep up to date. As an architect you have the added requirement of translating these into our systems which requires that I have a very indepth knowledge of the systems. Note also, the technology is constantly changing and making it harder, but also more interesting.

The advice I would give to young people includes having broad interests as these increase your experience and references you can draw on to solve problems. having more than a passing interest in all areas of the organization. As a project resource, I am called on to speak on many other areas of the business and sometimes, I draw on past projects experiences to help me with current projects. Some solutions are reused. Strong people skills, auditors are not easy to deal with. It is not a field that is quiet or has long periods of inactivity, so you must be prepared for the hours. I would also add, have a deep interest in your field, for instance, I am a founding member of the ACAMS group, tennis captain, and sometimes, I attend BIBA functions for networking. A lot of my work is automated and due to compliance, must run all the time and without errors as responding to the FSC, etc., so be prepared for challenges.

When not working, I am usually with my daughter who is 15 going on 30, my shadow as a former CEO calls her. She loves horses, going for drives and loves her pets, especially her cat.
