I started with the opening remarks after which President Peter Williams from our Sponsor Club, Rotary Club of Barbados, dealt with housekeeping matters.

The first presenters were Kaila Headley and Liana Welch from **DocuCred Barbados**, a micro business which focuses on the job applications process as well as business plans and proposals just to name a few. Their topic was "CV Writing & Interview Tips: From Entry to Executive". They gave advice on how to write an effective CV as well as how to be best prepared for a job interview. Although tips for management applications weren't touched on as advertised, it was still a good refresher for those in attendance.

The second presenters were Rtr Tracey Knight-Lloyd and her mentee Janelle Edwards, whose backgrounds are both in marketing. They spoke on the topic "*The Ultimate Guide to Social Media Branding*", in which Tracey allowed Janelle to take the lead. Their presentation, as the name suggested, focused on how to build your social media brand for both personal and professional use and how the two are interrelated. It was engaging, very informative and interactive, even though it was interrupted by a parade for about five minutes.

Persons, especially the guests, maximised the opportunity to interact with our presenters following the event. Some first-time visitors asked about joining the club including the presenters from DocuCred. Writing material was provided by **BL&P** and a brochure was also prepared with the presenters' bios, the agenda and menu. OBJECT OF ROTARY


