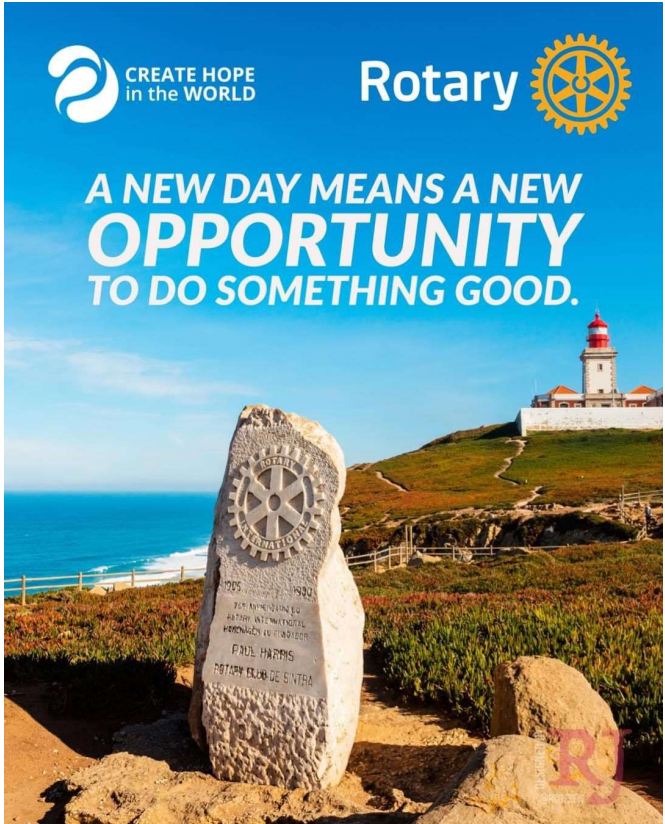
Today July 6th there will be no scheduled meeting. However, on Saturday July 8th will be the Annual Dinner & 61st Installation of Officers Ceremony.
