RECAP OF MAY 30 2019– BUSINESS MEETING

Last week's meeting was a Business Meeting, the Directors each presented their reports as we wind down the Rotary year.

Director Makonem reported on the "Hand Over" Rotaractor event on June 23rd at "The Ballpark" starting at 10:00 a.m. The dress code for this event is "Floral Chic" and all are encouraged to come out for a day of fun and support the incoming Board. He also updated us on the progress of the UWI Club and on the proposed pavilions which he said have already been designed and awaiting budgets and costing. Further he also indicated that Corporate Barbados has already expressed interest in the project.

Director Malcolm thanked everyone who came out to the recent Children's Beach Event on May 25, which was his last event for the Rotary year and he especially thanked the Rotaractors for their ongoing assistance.

Director Michael reported on attendance and projected that attendance should be at 67% by the end of May. Director Michael also shared plans for a Former Partners in Service recognition event which will invite all the Former Partners in Service of Rotarians who are no longer with us.

PP Ron Davis—Background to the School house and Our Involvement

Rotary's involvement with The Schoolhouse for Special Needs started in 2010 when we held our first fundraiser featuring the FABBAGIRLS, an ABBA tribute band. In subsequent years we again hosted the FABBAGIRLS, then The BEE GEES, The Illegal Eagles and in 2017 we put together all local artistes headed by Spice & Co.

Over the years Rotary has raised in excess of \$900,000.00 in cash towards this project. These funds have been used to provide scholarships for children who needed assistance and we also purchased a property on 1 acre at Brittons Hill where the school has operated since 2014.

Funds have also been donated in kind as companies assisted with renovating the Arts & Crafts Centre and providing paint for repainting the property.

The project has also been physically supported by Rotarians who turned out in their numbers to de-bush the back of the property in 2018 and more recently to paint the school building in 2019.

PP Ron Davis's Report Cont'd

Several Rotarians have also, on an annual basis, contributed to the payment of interest on the mortgage on the school property.

There is currently an outstanding mortgage of \$400,000.00 and funds raised from our annual tribute shows are used to pay this back.

The school will be hosting a fundraiser titled "Cork & Canvas" on the school grounds on June 22. Contribution is \$50.00 and proceeds will go to the scholarship funds.

Rotary's next big fundraiser will be held on November 9 when we host an Elton John Tribute Show.
