SAA Randy welcomed the Visiting Rotarians and Guests and reminded of our Guest Speaker of the day, Ms Joy-Anne Johnson who would engage us on the Topic: "Hurricane Preparedness During the COVID-19 Pandemic." She is the Programme Officer with the Department of Emergency Management.

GUEST SPEAKER

Our Speaker Ms. Johnson was introduced by Rotarian Jamella Forde and the VOT was given by Rotarian Chrispen.

Ms. Johnson started by enquiring of us what had changed over the years to impact on Hurricane Preparedness. She spoke of the impact of Climate Change and the necessity to be adequately prepared, especially in the area of Insurance Cover-

She recalled the financial impact visited by Hurricanes and Storms in the recent years.

On an annual basis humans lose their lives or Ms. Joyanne Johnson livelihoods and economies or sustain lasting damage due to numerous disasters.



- Over the last decade nearly a million people have been killed by disasters caused by storms, droughts and floods.
- The number of disaster events and their related economic and humanitarian losses have been increasing steadily since the 1990s.

Club Meeting - 29th April, 2021 Continued

- Overall losses from world-wide natural catastrophes in 2017 totaled \$330 billion dollars, these losses occurred from 740 events.
- The costliest natural catastrophe in 2017 ranked by insured losses was Hurricane Maria which caused \$32 billion in insured losses in the United States and the Caribbean.
- Hurricane Irma ranked at number three and Hurricane Harvey at number four both with \$30 billion in losses.
- The world's costliest natural catastrophes in 2017 were hurricanes, drought, wildfires, heat waves, hail, floods, earthquakes, cold frost.
- Overall losses from world-wide natural catastrophes in 2019 totaled \$166 billion from 860 events and 9,000 deaths
- Ranked by insured losses Hurricane Dorian ranked third with \$4 billion after two Typhoons which caused \$\$10 billion and \$7 billion
- The top five world costliest natural catastrophes by insured losses were from two (2) Typhoons, Hurricane Dorian, storms and floods
- Hurricane Dorian caused an estimated \$3.4 billion, hundreds dead or missing while 29,472 persons were affected by the hurricane

HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS & COVID19

- Take into account your usual Hurricane preparations, but add the new COVID19 protocols Masks, Sanitizing and Social Distancing
- Develop an Emergency Plan which should include the shelter closest to your home – information on your District Emergency Organisation (DEOs)
- Know your Shelters
- Volunteer with the local District Emergency Organisation Developing a family plan
- Your family may not be together when a disaster occurs; thus, it is important to know:
- -What you will do during a disaster and how will your family be reconnected immediately?
- -How will you contact family members to let them know you are

Develop an Emergency Evacuation Plan

- Take measures to protect your home and personal property
- Create an Emergency Evacuation Plan

Psychosocial Support and Stress Management in Disasters

- Just because you have experienced a disaster does not mean you will be damaged by it, but you will be changed by it. ...Weaver (1995)
- For every physical injury, there maybe ten times that amount of psychological injuries

Conclusion

- Disasters can occur anywhere, anytime and impact everyone
- Disasters can take away our safety and security, and disrupt our livelihoods
- Knowing what to do during a disaster can save lives and properties
- We cannot stop natural disasters from occurring
- We need to increase our preparedness efforts during the COVID-19 pandemic
- There are several stages to overcoming a disaster impact
- Be Prepared Be Aware


Roles and Responsibilities

Polio this week - No Wild Polio Virus Case is Reported in this week - 0 Afghanistan and 0 Pakistan. Total Globally Cases now are 2 in 2021, 140 in 2020, 176 cases in 2019 and 33 cases in 2018.

As on date, Pakistan now has 1 Case in 2021, 84 Cases in 2020 & 147 cases for 2019 and Afghanistan 1 Case 2021, 56 Cases 2020 & 29 cases in 2019.


