Last Thursday we were regaled by the District Rotaract Representative, Delon Earle. He gave an update of his role as he travels through the District.

SUMMARY OF THE PRESENTATION

As the District Rotaract Representative (DRR) you are required to provide a theme that would give your year. For this year's theme I choose 'We R'. Please allow me to express what it means:

R: The R has significance because it is the first letter in RI, Rotary International. R was chosen because it is recurring in RotaRy, RotaRact and InteRact. It represents our acknowledgement of Rotary International as a body of many arms, ready to serve Humanity.

'We' are those arms. Rotary International caters for humans of all ages to contribute meaningfully to the world. This must not be taken lightly. These two combined 'We' and 'R' gives us this year's theme and focus. 'We R' is the mantra that we must chant as we plan and execute our projects. We must involve our partners in service and interact clubs.

A theme pin was designed by Ms Marcelie Sears, Vice President of the Rotaractors Club of Innocently of Guyana, to be used as a symbolic representation of this concept. Please see the Rotaractors Theme Logo.

Please read the following description of the logo:

The arms are in a hexagon, this shape shows that amidst our many differences we are at the core equal in our focus for community develop. It points us to remember our Six areas of Focus:

Peace and conflict prevention/resolution

Disease prevention and treatment

Water and sanitation

Maternal and child health

Basic education and literacy

Economic and community development

The three arms, with the recognizable three colours, show how though each has its place in RI, we fulfill bigger picture of Rotary together. The deliberate triskelion-like pattern of the arms represents a tale of forward motion to reach understanding. District 7030 a unique district of islands and other countries of the continent of South America. The Sky Blue, Cranberry red and Gold arms recognizes Interact's, Rotaract's and Rotary's effort respectively

Though we have differences we, territories of 7030, have the commonality of our warm and friendly people added to the proliferation of flora and fauna in our respective countries. This is represented by the two shades of teal palm leaf shadowing the theme 'We R'.

I am currently traveling from island to island to attempt to complete my official visits to reach Rotaract clubs in the District. I have visited Grenada, St Vincent and the Grenadines before my visit to Barbados.

In keeping with the theme Rotaractors Clubs were urged to ensure that Rotary Clubs benefit from my visit as well and vice versa. Rotary clubs are especially to initiate projects from start to end in collaboration with their Rotaractors and Interactors.

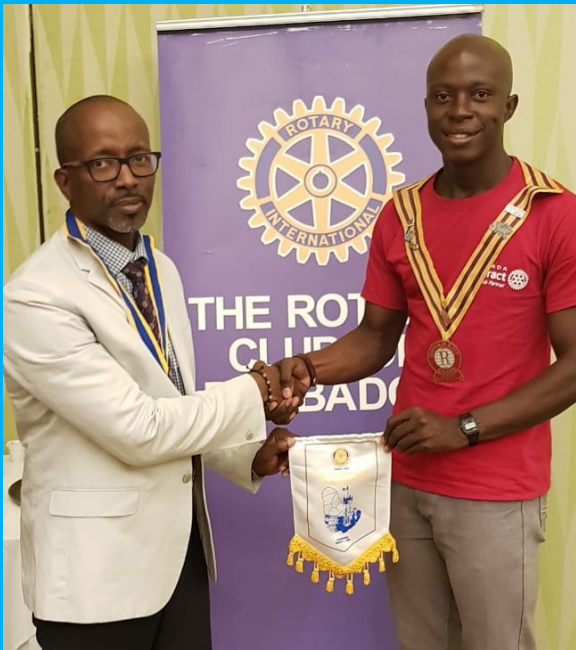

In 1988, when Rotary and its partners founded the GPEI, the paralyzing disease affected 350,000 children. Our collaboration with the [World Health Organization](#), [UNICEF](#), the [U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention](#), the [Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation](#), local health workers, and national governments has helped reduce the number to just 14 cases so far this year.

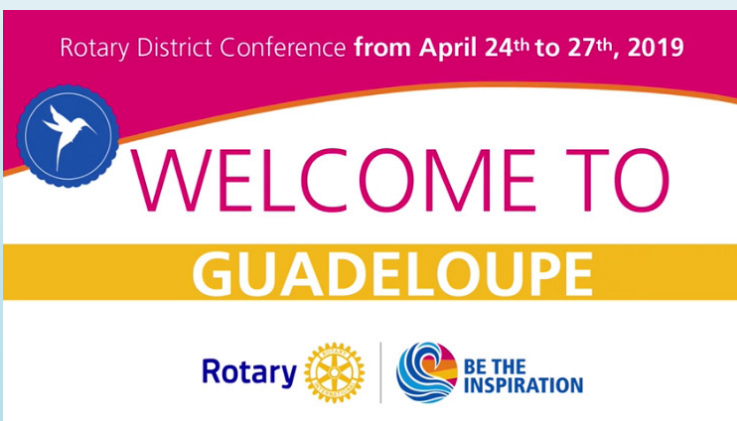
