RECAP OF JANUARY 31st FELLOWSHIP MEETING & THE THIRD WEEK OF M(odel) U(nited) N(ations)



As we seek to be relevant and engage competent resource persons and the membership on educational and topical discussions, last week Mr. Jerry Franklin, engaged us on the very relevant topic of the 'Green Economy.'

Mr Franklin is the President of the Barbados Renewable Energy Association.

Following is a summary of his presentation

The "Green Economy" is on "hyper drive" given the directive for Barbados to be 100% Green by 2030.

"The green economy is defined as an economy that aims at reducing environmental risks and ecological scarcities, and that aims for sustainable development without degrading the environment. It is closely related with ecological economics, but has a more politically applied focus."

Mr. Franklin answered the question everyone was thinking about following the above statement— What does it mean to have a 100% green economy by 2030?

Barbados is expected to move to a place where most of the energy utilized locally is generated by biomass. The aim is to move away from fossil fuels.

This move will impact on many of our basic functions. With Transportation there will be the move to Electric vehicles from the use of fossil fuels.

There will be an obvious cost implication as public transportation will be expected to follow the route of Electric vehicles.

The Capital Costs associated with this objective will be front loaded however the concomitant savings will be seen in the long run.



What Does the Green Economy really mean for Barbados?

Barbados going 100% Renewable Energy by 2030 will grow the Green Economy.

It means - **Green** jobs as we transition to 100% Renewable Energy.

It means - Reduced US dollars going out to buy Oil. This can significantly increase GDP.

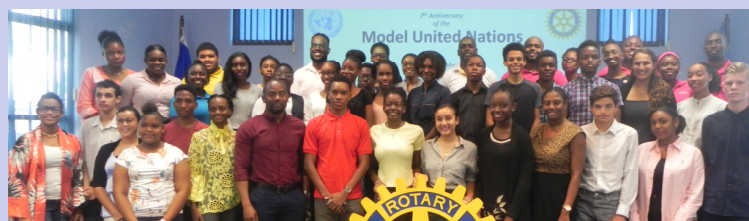
MUN: January 19—March 09
