# Summary of RCOB Weekly Meeting held on June 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2022

The 49<sup>th</sup> and final Fellowship Meeting of the Rotary Year was called to order at 12:30 pm

- Our guest speaker for the day is Award winning CNN news anchor and host Michael Holmes and we were joined by the media: Barbados Today
- Rtn. Keri gave the prayer
- On Monday we lost PP John Jones PP of Rotary Club of Barbados South – the club held a moment of silence
- Acting Sergeant-at-arms PP Michael congratulated President Robin on his magnificent year as President and also acknowledged his join date anniversary today 30 June 1994. The guests and visiting Rotarians were introduced
- PP Carole gave the Rotary Foundation Minute
- President Robin thanked Director Arlene for her work as our club won Platinum Certificate for Public Image and won Silver District Governor's citation
- PP Sir Trevor introduced the Guest Speaker Michael Holmes
- Michael Holmes is an award-winning anchor and correspondent for CNN International based at the network's headquarters in Atlanta
- Holmes anchors CNN "Newsroom with Michael Holmes" Friday through Monday mornings between 12 and 3am ET

#### Guest Speaker – Michael Holmes "Career at CNN"

- Michael Holmes started his career in reporting at the age of 16 at a newspaper and recounted his first interaction with Rotary when the newspaper sent him for a week to cover the Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) in Australia.
- Through this experience he forged a lifetime of friendships. At age 29 he backpacked across Europe and some of these same Rotarians opened their homes to him
- He was nominated for a scholarship by Rotary but unfortunately had to turn it down due to a promotion at work
- After working in newspapers for almost 5 years he began his television career in 1982 where he covered many international historic events such as the fall of the Berlin wall, Romanian Revolution, Rwandan Genocide, Iraq War, Libya Revolution and most recently the Ukraine/Russia conflict (to name a few)
- In addition to conflict coverage, Michael also covers world news related to the impact of climate seen with these numerous catastrophic hurricanes.
   Michael covered and spent time in the Caribbean with Hurricanes Maria and Irma

- His presentation was well received, with good membership engagement which included some several thought-provoking questions from members (PP Algie, Dir Anton, PP Jedder, Rtn. Sanjay, and Rtn. Davina) and the media present.

## **Highlights From The Rotary Foundation Minutes 2021-22**

2004- Every Rotarian Every Year (EREY) – encourages each Rotarian to donate at least US\$100.00 to the Annual Fund, which forms primary source of funding for Foundation programs.

2007 – Gates \$100m challenge. RI received a \$100million Bill Gates Foundation Grant which Rotary committed to match by raising \$100 million for polio eradication.

2013 – Grant models simplified – District and Global Grants.

2016 - Centennial year for the Foundation.

2016 – The Rotary Foundation named one of the world's outstanding philanthropic organisations and holds the highest consultative status offered to an NGO by the United Nations. 2020 – Rotary Foundation received a perfect score of 100 per cent, earning it a 4-star rating as a charity navigator. Charities with a perfect score are fiscally responsible and adhere to good governance and other best practices that minimize the chance of unethical activities.

## History

1917 - Foundation was started.

1930 – Donated \$500 to Easter Seals.

1947 - Start of Ambassadorial Scholarships.

1957 – Paul Harris Recognition commenced. Recognizes \$1,000 contribution.

1963 – Matching Grants Program.

1965 - Introduction of Group Study Exchange.

1979 - Polio Eradication Program.

1999 - Rotary Peace Centres and Peace Fellows Program – 7 Peace Centres at 7 prestigious universities worldwide.

## **Sundry Highlights from the Minutes:**

- The Rotary Foundation helps Rotary members to advance world understanding, goodwill and peace by improving health, providing quality education, improving the environment and alleviating poverty.as
- The largest project undertaken by the Foundation is the eradication of polio.
- Since the Foundation was founded more than 100

- years ago, it has spent more than \$4 billion on life changing and sustainable projects.
- The Foundation is dedicated to assisting in 7 areas of focus promoting peace; fighting disease; providing clean water, sanitation and hygiene; saving mothers and children; supporting education, growing local economies and protecting the environment.
- Membership in the Paul Harris Fellow program and Paul Harris Society.
- Requirements for Paul Harris Fellow+1 with sapphire and Paul Harris Fellow+6 with ruby.
- Understanding Paul Harris points to be transferred from club to individual and individual to individual but not from individual to club.

## **Statistical Data from the Minutes:**

- Last year, Rotary Foundation spent \$9.2 million to grow local economies and reduce proverty.
- 795 million people or every 1 in 9 persons in the world do not have enough to eat.
- 60% of the world's hungry people are women and girls.
- 70% of the world's poorest people live in rural areas and depend on agriculture and related activities for their livelihood.
- 60 cents can protect a child from polio.
- \$50 can provide clean water.
- \$500 can fund healthy environments for children.



#### OBJECT OF ROTARY


The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and in particular to encourage and foster:
