

What is "The Rotary Foundation"?

As members of the Rotary family, we from time to time hear mention of "The Rotary Foundation", but do we know anything about it?

Well, fear not because it so happens that in the Rotary International calendar, November is dedicated to "The Rotary Foundation", so let us get to know about this organisation and its purpose. The following words by Arch Klumph, founder of The Rotary Foundation "We should not live for ourselves alone, but for the joy in doing good for others," gave birth to "The Rotary Foundation" ("The Foundation") back in 1917.


It was created to aid in the funding of humanitarian activities, from local service projects to global initiatives. Clubs or Districts can apply for grants from the Foundation to invest in their projects and provide scholarships, empowering clubs to approach challenges such as poverty, illiteracy, and malnutrition with sustainable solutions that leave a lasting impact. The Foundation also leads the charge on worldwide Rotary campaigns such as the eradication of polio and promoting peace.

Rotarians and friends of Rotary support the Foundation's work through their voluntary contributions to the Annual Fund. These contributions help Rotary clubs create positive change within their communities and around the world. They also help strengthen peace efforts, provide clean water and san itation, support education, grow local economies, save mothers and children, and most notably fight disease.


US\$4 billion has been spent by The Rotary Foundation on life-changing, sustainable projects worldwide throughout its 100-year history. Grants from The Rotary Foundation support over 1,000 projects every year. 2018 saw, The Rotary Foundation providing more than US\$86 million to 1,306 grants.

- US\$35.6 million given for disease prevention and treatment
- US\$18.7 million given to water and sanitation projects
- US\$10.9 million given for education and literacy projects
- US\$10.5 million given for growing local economics
- US\$7.2 million given for saving the lives of mothers and children
- US\$3.5 million given for efforts promoting peace
- · What impact can one donation have?
- For as little as US\$0.60, a child can be protected from polio.
- US\$50.00 can provide clean water to help fight waterborne illness.
- US\$500.00 can launch an anti-bullying campaign and create a safe environment for children.
