

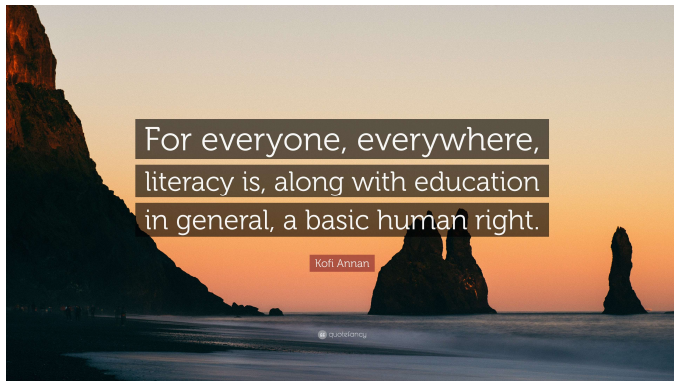


Today, September 7<sup>th</sup>, is a Business Meeting, which commences at 12:30 p.m. at the Hilton Hotel.
